## SECRETARY'S RBPPORT.

In addition to the written report, the Secretary informed the neeting of the following:-

That he now sends a copy of the magazine to "Cyaling". He pointed out that the extra cost of transporting the duplicator and magazine paper from Manor Park to Rainham when Mr. Periberton was takom ill, plus the extra duplicating ink we had acquired - enough to print all 1969 magazines (this was done in cese tox. was raised on ink again) these items obviously were the cause of a slight deficit in the yearly accounts.

Mr. Hanlin proposed that the Secretary's report be recoived, with a vote of thanks to him and this was seconded by Mir. M. Trueman.

## TREASURER'S RFPPORT.

It was proposed by Mrs. M. Lang that this report be recaived, with a vote of thanks for the work done in getting subscriptions im. This was seconded by Mr. J. Cohen.

## AITREATION TO RULE 3, SECTTON A.

It was proposed by Mr. J. Jefford and seconded by Mr. A. Middloton that this rule be altered; as recomended by the committeo, to read as follows:-
"The affairs of the Club shall be managed by a committee appointed each year at the A.G.M., consisting of Chaiman, Secretary, Treasurer, Editor, Runs Leader from each Section and four comittee meribers".

Mr. Good was not elected. Mrs. Lang suggested that Mr. Good be the first menber to be co-opted should the need arise.

Rr. Germain asked about the Northern Ireland Section. The Socretary pointed out that. this section should elect its own loader and run its affairs there: They retain half the subscriptions they get in for this. In this particular case, we do print their runs on our list and forvard these runs programes to them; this, the Secretary thought, gave then am idea of what was happening in the London area. Mir. Jefford proposed and Mr. German seconded that the Secretary write to Mir. Henry, the Northern Ireland leader, informing hin that: should any of their nombers be in Iondon when neetings are being. held, they would be wolcove to attend.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS.
Mr. Jefford proposed' and Mrs. N. White seconded that the Club send a wreath to the Menorial Service held at Meriden in May. Meeting agreeđ.
C.T.C. DEFENCE FUND.

Mr. Drewett proposed that a contribution be sent to the C.T.C. and Mr. Duffin seconded this.

In the goneral discussion, Mr. Duffin said that the C.T.C. President and Secretary were working, hard fighting for the cyclist"s rights on the road in this notor age.

One dissenter did not agree with the donation being given, his reasons being that the C.T.C. had 20,000 nembers and he did not think they (the C.T.C. officials) were showing eno ugh initiative in making eash.

The Chaimen then callod for a vote on this natter and, with only one rorber opposing, this proposition wis carried. He then askedifor propositions regarding the anount to be donated:

Mr. Padley proposed, Mr. Fankin seconded - £25.

Mr. Dedd . . m. . Mr. J. Devey " - £40.
Mr. Seymour then pointed out that we only had $£ 57$ in belance, but the Treasurer, explaining his firures on the balance shoet, said we had in hand, after comuted: subscriptions had been allowed for, £125, so the Club could afford £25. Mr. Seynour, although accepting this; sugsested that should the cost of runnine the club shoot up sucdenly (which is quite a possibility in this doy and age) and we had to raise the subsariptions to our members; the connittee could find thenselves in an enberrassing position if too big a donation wo nate.

Mr. Dadd thought that giving £40 would boost our Club in the oyes of others.

Mr. Padiey suggested that tho G.T.C. noeded the cash urgently.
Mr:. Formain said it was not so zuch the amount but our Club giving the lead, he hoped, to other private clubs: to follow suit.

Mrs. N. White suiggested that $£ 10.10 .0$ be the highest we
donated and then consider giving again ini. the future, according to how the Clum's fiunds were:

1. Minutes of the last committee meeting-were-accepted-as-a-true-and correct-record.
2. Matters arising.

The sscretary said he had heard from Mr. Tackley re the advertising done in local papers in the-Bognor-and-Chichester-areas,but-MrTackley so_far_had_had no luck in recruiting members and forming a section there.

The secretary expressed surprise that the C.T.C. had not given publicity regarding-the-donation-sent-from-our-c-lub-,-as-our-ideawas_to try and encourage other private clubs to follow suit, and so help in the defence of cyclist's rights on the roads.
Secretary reported that he had contacted Mrs. Lang and Mr. Groom regarding-them-speaking-at-the-reuni-on-lunch--and-both-agreed-to-doso.
3. Secretary's report.

He reported that inquiries were still coming in for information about-the-club, and-i-n-some-cases-folk-had-joi-ned-As-a_result_of the advertisments in "Cycletouring", he had received letters from as far afield as Pakistan and U. S. A. Previous inquirer's who had not
joined, had been sent current runs programmes.
One-thi-ng-tha-t-was_disturbing,-was_anslight_decline_in_the_number of members out on Sunday runs, and he thought this could be due to runs going too far out for that section's area, and suggested perhaps bounbaries could be arranged for each sections runs. Apart from-this-g-he_reported_that_the_club_was_still_running smoothly. Magazines had been sent to Mrs. Willard and Mrs. Taylor,folk who had recently catered for the club.

5. Any unsiness.

Mr. Trueman suggested that the amount of cash kept in the current account was rather high, and could be used to make interest. The treasurer-explained-his-fi-gures, and-the-commi-t-tee-agreed-tha-t-dueto the trouble the treasurer would have to go to, re form filling, for income tax purposes, it was as well to leave this as it was for the present. Of the outstanding payments of subscriptions, the treasurer-sai-d-he-would-send-ou-t-a-f-i-na-l-remi-nder.

committee members. Mr. Hankin assured the committee that the arrangements were in hand and O.K.

## Any other business.

Mr--Duffi-n-said-he-was-inclined_to-agree_with the_secretaryis-suggestionof section boundaries, as it could happen that the same place could be the venue 2 weeks running. The secretary pointed out that at times, it could mean, that in actual fact, a section would not have, a run in their area-on_their_allot.ted-date,-and_sugges.ted_that_s.ec.tion_date.s_c.ould_be put in the magazine, and a note attached, inviting members to suggest, venues, and if possible, lead that particular run. The committee agreed that this idea could be tried, and so the secretary agreed to go ahead wi.th_this. The_Chairman_suggested_that_in_the_mean time, the 4 leaders concernedngot together, to sought out their next quarters runs, and so avoid covering each others area. This they agreed to do. Regarding-Low-attendances-on-the-Western-and-Northern-runs-on-Sundays, Mr. Hankin pointed out that the midweek section in these areas, preffered to go somewhere on Sundays where they could obtain a hot meal, as they carried sandwiches during the week, and so at times the runs were not i-tab-le-for-them.
A matter regarding a member being refused a booking at one of the club's regular catering establishments was discussed by the committee, and after hearing the secretary's report on this, agreed that we only visited thi-s-place-a-t-less-f-fequent-i-nterval-s-The-complai-nt-against-the-member was in respect of a private visit he had made there, according to the proprietor, and the committee felt that this was of no concern of the club at all, and should have been dealt with by the proprietor at the time,-and-he-had-simply-tried-to-get_his_point_over to_the member_through the secretary, who had actually dealt with this booking. Meeting closed at 16.45 prs .
