Year 1971

Minutes of the 20th, A.G.M. held at the "Crown & Sugar Loaf" inn, Garlick Hill, London, E.C.4, on Saturday, 3rd, April, 1971.

Meeting opened at 3.p.m. with the chairman welcoming members, and reading letters of apologies from Mr. Parsons, Mr. Duffin, and Mr. Holden, who could not attend.

1. Minutes of the 19th. A.G.M. were read.

Mr. D. Lang proposed they be accepted as a true record.

Mr. F. Good seconded this. Meeting agreed.

2. Matters arising.

Members asked what had been arrived at regarding the Lew Downey memorial fund. The chairman replied that this had been dealt with by the committee. The secretary thought that this fund was now defunct, as the person who instituted it, had left the Basildon area, and on this information, it had been wound up. The meeting then decided to close this matter.

3. Secretary's report.

This was in the hands of all members, the secretary adding that he had missed reporting on the Northern Ireland section, but he explained that this section was still in existence, and runs were programmed during the summer months, but what support Mr. Henry received on these runs, we had no information. The meeting was informed that the secretary had ordered 5,000 magazine covers before there was another rise in costs.

The secretary had received a letter from a person in Northumberland asking if we had a section there. In reply to the secretary's answer to this person, she informed him that a friend of hers was thinking of starting a cycling club in the area mentioned. The secretary then wrote back informing her of conditions of starting a Forty Plus section, and offering, if they could get started, to amend our "Cycletouring" advertisement to include them.

Mr. Jefford proposed, & Mrs. Lang seconded that the secretary's report be accepted with thanks. Meeting agreed.

4. Treasurer's report.

This was in the hands of all members.

Mr. Jefford proposed that the report be adopted with thanks to the treasurer for his good work in getting subscriptions in.

Mrs. Lang seconded this.

5. Election of officers.

Secretary informed the meeting that Mr. Duffin was still prepared to lead the Eastern section for another year if elected.

Mr. Bolch informed the meeting that he could not stand for election for leadership of the Western section. The chairman thanked Mr. Bolch for his past services in leading this section.

The secretary then asked for nominations for chairman, Mr. Pemberton again being elected, and thanked the meeting for so doing.

He then took over from the secretary to ask for nominations for the remaining offices and committee members.

5. As the chairman was unable to get a leader for the Western section in the first place, Mr. Caudle kindly consented to have his name put forward, on the understanding that he would do his best, but, due to his commitments, his wife being in poor health, he could not guarantee to be present on all the runs, but would programme for the Western section, in the hope that if he is not present, someone will step in and lead on that particular day. The chairman thanked Mr. Caudle for his help, this had at least stopped the section from folding up.

6. Handbooks.

The secretary read out a copy of a minute published in 1962, to refresh members minds on what had been discussed in the past on this subject. Both the secretary & treasurer then outlined the club's financial position regarding raising subscriptions, bearing in mind that we now had quite a number of members who had retired on fixed incomes, and these were the folk who were hit most by inflation. Obviously the cost of handbooks has risen over the years, and would continue to do so as things were going. The secretary then proposed that we had a skeleton handbook printed, with just the constitution of the club officials and committee numbers, and each year send out with the first edition of the magazine after the A.G.M. a duplicated list of officials for the year names, plus all members names & addresses up to that date. Mr. Germain seconded this proposal.

Mr. Fitzpatrick then proposed an amendment that the whole thing, rules, officials, names & addresses of all members be duplicated each year to save expense.

Mr. Russell seconded this amendment.

Mr. Trueman spoke very strongly against both these proposals, explaining that he thought that we were getting cycling too cheaply, and so becoming the poor relations of sport & pastime.

After further discussion, the chairman then called for a vote, putting the amendment first, and this was carried, 17 votes for, and 9 against.

The chairman then explained that this could just be for a trial period.

7. Reunion run and 21st anniversary celebrations.

Mr. Jefford proposed & Mrs. Lang seconded that a dinner & dance be arranged in town for this in 1972.

On a show of hands, 21 folk were in favour of this, but there was quite a bit of dissent from the remaining members present, and Mr. Fitzpatrick pointed out that 21 was hardly a good enough figure to represent the feelings on this matter for 200 members, for such an important occasion, the club's 21st birthday.

Mr. Knapp then suggested that perhaps we could arrange a mid-day lunch in town (London) on a Sunday, this would mean that folk could have a chat over a drink before lunch, and then continue the chat after lunch. After discussion, Mr. Fitzpatrick suggested that the secretary sent out to all members a circular asking which of these suggestions were acceptable to them.

The secretary agreed to do this, and send these circulars out with the 1971 June edition of the magazine.

The chairman opened the discussion on the reunion run saying that Mr. Duffin did not consider this event worth running, as it did not get enough support.

Mr. Jefford explained that this event had been advertised as a reunion lunch not as a reunion run, here as he explained was the difference, for on a reunion run, one has not to book a lunch, but could take packed lunch, the main object was to get the members together from all sections once a year.

Mr. Jefford then proposed, & Mr. Middleton seconded that the club had a reunion run in 1972. Meeting agreed.

This was then left to the committee to try & arrange a date and venue.

8. Any other competent business.

Mr. Jefford proposed & Mr. Middleton seconded that the club send a wreath for the cyclist's war memorial service at Meriden. Agreed. Secretary then informed members that he would be making a collection for our bed ridden member, Ron Masters, & would also like to raise enough cash to give a Christmas record token to Dick Holden, who has lost his sight. The response to this was £6-53½ collected. Meeting closed at 5.15.p.m. with Mr. Fitzpatrick proposing a vote of thanks to the chairman.

Dear members,

Once again it is my privilege to report another successful year regarding membership of this great club of ours, but what we must not overlook, is the need for new members between the ages of 40 & 50 years, if this club is to carry on as a real cycling unit, for it is not all of our members who have the health & ability to still be cycling at club pace when having reached the age of 60 years & over, and it is the younger folk we are looking to, to fill the gaps. At the present moment, we are fortunate to have a committee of mostly all riding members, but all except 3 being over 60 years of age, but still willing to carry on this work if again elected, but the day must come, when younger folk will have to step into the breach.

With regret I have to announce the passing of the following members during 1970, Artur Batt, Tom Eynon, Bert Brighty, & Harold Cook. With the exception of the Western section, all runs have been well supported, the committee would welcome any comments from members in this area as to how to improve this situation in this section. Traffic conditions may be the prime factor here, we don't know, perhaps members could enlighten us on this. Again the bank holiday tourlets have been a success, but it is becoming increasingly difficult to obtain private accommodation. The big success of the club this year has been the turn-outs on the St. Albans mid-week runs, numbers ranging from 16 to 20 members per trip, something new in the cycling world I would think. Our biggest problem at the moment is inflation, but with the co-operation of George Knapp, treasurer & Lew Pemberton, chairman, who obtains our duplicating paper at cheap rate, we can, I hope, with certain alterations in the financial running of the club affairs, keep our subscription at its present level, this I might add, is always under scrutiny of your committee.

As in previous terms of office, I must again thank the committee members for the excellent support they have given me in 1970, almost 100% attendances at all meetings, also my thanks to Stan Russell and Vi Willcox in enabling me to get the magazine out on time, and don't forget folks, please keep Stan provided with plenty of news. Twice during 1970 our magazine was praised in the cycling press, a compliment to the members who write the articles. Good riding and good health for 1971,

TREASURER'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1970.

During the year, 15 new members were enrolled, and with only 4 resignations the paid membership for 1970 was 201 compared with 192 for 1969.

Looking at the 1970 accounts, you may be struck by the increase in expenditure on "Signpost" materials from £18 in 1969 to £64 in 1970 and the consequential drop in the cash balance from £119 to £91. I would like to explain that, during the year, advantage was taken of an opportunity to purchase a large quantity of magazine paper at a very reasonable price and the value of stocks of paper, stencils, ink, etc. held by the Hon. Secretary at the year end was in the region of £50 compared with some £12 at the beginning of the year. Apart from this, our expenditure has been contained very well, and our finances remain extremely healthy, a comfortable position with so many price increases on the way.

Regarding "Signpost", I would like to pay a tribute (and here I know from my correspondence that I voice the opinion of many of our members) to the continuing very high standard of the Club magazine. It plays a major role in keeping within the Club a number of members who, at 60-Plus and 70-Plus, are not able to take an active part in our activities but who certainly remain with us in spirit. We owe a big debt to our Editor, our contributors and those responsible for the production of our magazine.

Minutes of committee meeting held at the "Crown & Sugar Loaf" inn, Garlick Hill, London, E.C.4, on Sat, 16th, Jan, 1971. (48)

Members present. Mrs. Lang, Mrs. Willcox, Mr, Jefford, Hankin, Bolch, Russell, Stewart, Cannon, Knapp, Pemberton, Middleton, Good, Duffin, and Wooder.

Apologies for absence was received from Mr. Drewett.

Mr. Hankin reported the death of Mr. H. Cook of Ipswich.

Minutes of last committee meeting.

These were read and accepted as a true and correct record.

Prop: Mr. Knapp. Seconded. Mr. Good.

Matters arising.

The secretary reported that re the reunion lunch, he had sent out 43 letters to members.

Sec's report & correspondence.

Secretary reported that membership still steady at around 195.

Enquiries were still coming in via the medium of the C.T.C. advertisement. On the request of Mrs. Willcox, the secretary had sent a magazine and current runs list to a Mrs. Shutes, but had heard no more. Mr. Mapstone had moved and his new address was unknown.

Mr. Charlesworth had also moved and his new address had still to be found. Mrs. Lang thought she could help to obtain this one.

Secretary reported that he had enough stocks of duplicating paper for 3 years of magazine production, and 4 years of runs lists and A.G.M, minutes production.

All correspondence had been dealt with up to date.

Treasurer's report. (CASH & MEMBERSHIP DETAILS ARE ATTACHED)

Treasurer reported that he had received news that George Sibley had had rather a nasty accident. Secretary promised he would visit this member. News had also been received from Mr. H. Peck whom we had not seen for a long time. Treasurer asked secretary to ensure that Mr. McLachlan name was spelt correctly in the next handbook edition. Prop: Mr. Jefford & seconded Mr. Bolch that the treasurer's report be accepted with thanks.

Magazine covers.

Secretary reported that he had 1 years stock of these, and suggested the club obtain more before prices rise again. Mr. Jefford prop: & Mrs. Lang seconded that the secretary order 5,000 copies. Colour as before.

Handbooks and postage.

Secretary said in view of the proposed increase in postal charges, perhaps the committee could recommend to the members at the A.G.M, that the handbook be discontinued, and that in its place the secretary would duplicate rules, names and addresses each year. He explained that the cost of the handbook had risen from about £7/10/- to £11 per year. Secretary's and magazine postage plus phone calls in 1970 were £23, of this, the secretary estimated about £20 was for postage. When proposed increases come into force, this would add approximately £20 a year to postage bill, which would mean raising the club subscription. With the saving on the handbook, this could possibly be avoided. The treasurer assured the committee that providing then,

That cash was not voted for outside causes, he could see no reason if these measures were carried out, we would not have to increase subscriptions. Mr. Jefford suggested that the committee have a set danger level cash balance, so that the committee could act if a cash emergency arose.

Advertising.

Mrs. Lang had renewed the advertisement in the Eastern Counties Magazine for 1971 at the cost of £1.

The committee agreed that the secretary should contact the editor of "Cycletouring magazine" re our advertisement being renewed for another year, and also have the wording altered to include Thursday runs in the east of London.

Reunion lunch.

Mr. Duffin suggested that a reunion lunch be run every 3 years, instead of annually as at present, and that each section concentrate on its Christmas dinners more to bring folk together. He expressed disappointment at the poor attendance at the Eastern section Xmas dinner. Mr. Duffin proposed and Mr. Hankin seconded that there be no reunion lunch in 1971. Committee agreed that this must go on the A.G.M, agenda coupled with the 21st anniversary event to be held in 1972, should members so desire. Mr. Jefford pointed out that in the first place, the suggestion was a reunion run not lunch, this had been mis interpreted by the secretary. After further discussion, the committee thought perhaps a reunion run would be the answer, again this to be discussed at the A.G.M.

A.G.M. 1971.

Secretary suggested that as the rules did not lay down any specific date, would the committee agree to April, 3rd, 1971, the reason being that the Agenda & minutes etc, could go out with the next edition of the magazine, thus saving postage. Committee agreed.

Any other business.

Mr. Bolch suggested he discontinue leading the Western section due to lack of support. The chairman explained that as the section runs were now published, this was hardly possible, and suggested that Mr. Bolch carried on until the A.G.M, in April.

THE FORTY PLUS CYCLING CLUB. 1971 - 1972.

Rules, Committee, Members names and addresses.

RULES AND CONDITIONS OF MEMBERSHIP.

NAME.

1. The Club shall be known as "The Forty Plus Cycling Club" and membership shall be open to cyclists over 40 years of age.

OBJECTS.

2. The objects of the Club shall be to promote fixtures of a social character in areas where there may be sufficient support, and to provide for the interests of members in such other ways as may be decided upon.

MANAGEMENT.

3.
 - (a) The affairs of the Club shall be managed by a committee appointed each year at the Annual General Meeting; consisting of Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, Runs Leader from each Section, and 4 Committee Members.
 - (b) The Committee shall have power to co-opt or appoint other members as required from time to time.
 - (c) At meetings of the Committee 5 members present shall constitute a Quorum.
 - (d) By arrangement with the Committee separately operating Sections may be formed with their own elected Section Secretary and Treasurer to manage the Section's affairs, subject to the over-riding powers of the Committee.

SUBSCRIPTIONS.

4.
 - (A) The annual subscription of 50NP shall be payable by each member on joining and on 1st January in each following year.
 - (b) The annual subscription shall cover membership from 1st January to 31st December provided that a member joining the Club after 30th June shall pay half the current subscription to the Club for that year.
 - (c) A member who shall not have renewed his or her subscription by 31st March in any year may be deemed by the Committee to have resigned.
 - (d) Any member who has completed a full years membership may commute 5 years' subscriptions by payment of a sum equal to 4 times the amount of the annual subscription payable at the time of an application to commute being made by a member.
A married couple may pay a combined annual subscription of 75NP or a commuted subscription of £3 for 5 years (having both completed a years membership) for which they would receive only one magazine per quarter, and only one set of rules and members names and addresses yearly.

All commuted subscriptions shall be dealt with under the provisions of Rule 5, Classes (a) and (b)

Applications to commute subscriptions should be made in writing to the Club Treasurer before an annual subscription becomes due on 1st January in any year. All applications to commute subscriptions

must be accompanied by the full amount due and no such application can be considered after 31st March in any year.

4. (d) continued.

A member who, under the provisions of Clause (b) of Rule 4, has paid half the annual subscription for the year in which membership commenced shall not be eligible for commuted membership until 1st January in the following year.

FUNDS AND ACCOUNTS.

5.

- (a) The funds of the Club shall be collected and held by the Treasurer and shall be administered by him under the direction of the Committee except that
- (b) Where a separately operating Section has been formed its members may pay their subscriptions to the Section Secretary, who shall hold and administer the Section funds remaining in his hands after payment to the Club Treasurer of one half of the Section's annual subscriptions.
- (c) The Section Secretary shall furnish to the Club Treasurer an account of the receipts and payments of the Section as at 31st December in each year, to lay before the Annual General Meeting.
- (d) The Club Treasurer shall prepare the Club accounts as at 31st December each year, which shall be audited and laid before the Annual General Meeting.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

6.

- (a) The Annual General Meeting shall be held in London as soon as practicable after 31st December to receive the Report of the Club Secretary and the Accounts of the Hon. Treasurer, to elect the Officers and Committee for the ensuing year, and to deal with other competent business of the Club. Members shall be given 14 days notice of the date of the Annual General Meeting.
- (b) Motions for the Agenda must reach the Club Secretary not later than 7th January.
- (c) At the Annual General Meeting 15 members present shall constitute a quorum.

MEAL BOOKINGS.

- 7. Members requiring meals booked must advise the Section Leader concerned 7 days in advance. No responsibility shall rest on a Section Leader to obtain meals for members who have not booked in accordance with this rule.
- 8. Members may be accompanied on Club fixtures by members of their own family under 40 years of age.
- 9. Alterations or additions to these rules may only be made at a general meeting of members (notice of which shall have been given 14 days in advance) and shall require a two-thirds majority of members present to be carried.
