## TRAFFIC SIGNS REGULATIONS REVISION

1. Thank you for your letter dated 18 February 1974.
2. I can confirm it is the intention to phase out the use of metal studs to mark parking places. Their use for this purpose is increasingly rare now. Most other uses of studs require them to be fitted with reflectors to illuminate the associated road markings and usually these are of the well known depressible types. However the occasional use of these studs to mark advisory pedestrian crossing places or those controlled for limited time periods by policemen is retained, al though it is envisaged that in practice local authorities will increasingly make use of the alternative possibility of flat plastic white squares fitted to the carriageway.
3. The use of traffic cones as a device to delineate road works is now fairly well proven. It is often very necessary to provide for coning off considerable areas of road on the approach to road works to sensibly and safely channel traffic. The introduction of the 'cylinder' version does not extend the use of the device but provides an alternative shape which can make use of the socket fitting of 'catseye' road studs in certain very limited cases. Since these will only be used to close off gaps in central reservations of dual carriageways or to divide opposing flows of traffic on the same carriageway I would doubt that they would give rise to any difficulty to cyclists.
4. I can confirm that there are no proposals to increase the size of traffic signs. In fact the final drawings for the Regulations will in some cases indicate a new size as the smallest alternative for use on very narrow or little used roads.

Mr. Good said that he would contact Mr. Clisby, to see if we could have either \(26 / 7\) Sept. or \(3 / 4\) oct. Neither of these dates would clash with the Cambridge Week-end which some members attended and he would let Mrs Ford know which date was agreed sothat she could make an announeement in the June Signpost.
Mrs.Gardner said that she had only recently heard that we used to send a copy of Signpost to the Editor of Cycle-Touring and that she was not instructed to send a copy when she took over the Secretary's job, did the committe want this done in future. After some discussion it was agreed that she write to ask if we could be included in the "List of useful names and addresses" that is inserted if the CTC Diary each year. Mr.Newman asked the committee's permission to purchase mover paper for the production of Runs Lists nd Magazine, this was readily given. The meeting commenced at 12.15 there being eleven members present, appologies were received from Mrs.Ford, Mr.Wooder and Mr.Collins.

The minutes of the meeting held on l8th July 1981 were read and after a small addition regarding the re-union on Saturday 27th June last they were accepted as a true record. Prop. Mr. Germain and seconded by Mr.Good.
