Minutes of the Annual General Meeting of the Forty Plus Cycling Club.  
Held on Sunday 7th February 1982 at Treetops Hotel. Epping.

The meeting commenced at 11.15 am with Mr. Trueman in the Chair.

The Minutes of the previous A.G.M. Held on 7th February 1981 were read and accepted as a true record. Proposed by Mr. Wooder. 2nd. Mr. Collins.

MATTERS ARISING.

The question of a supply of Cloth Badges came up and Mr. Kersey spoke about some ordered by the Essex Roads Club that were £2. to £3. each, and he thought that the club could do the same. Mrs. Walker said that many people had asked for them and she would be able to sell 15 right now if we had them, she hoped that the Club would go on for a long time yet, new members were always coming in who would buy badges and she thought that it would be a good idea and seemed worth it. Mr. Trueman said that comparing the price with the last lot we had, even taking inflation into account the cost of £2. to £3. seemed a lot. Mr. Wooder wondered if the ones that Mr. Kersey spoke of would be rather ornate for that price, and that it would perhaps be a little cheaper if more than the 50 that Mr. Kersey's club had ordered, were obtained by us. After some discussion by other members it was generally agreed that we do order 50 from the same firm. This proposal being set by Mr. Kersey and 2nd. by Mr. A. Richards. Mr. Germain asked just how many had been sold by the club during the last couple of years and Mrs. Gardner said none as the stocks had run out and the committee had agreed not to order any more at the time. After voting, 27 for the purchase and 2 against, Mrs. Gardner said she would get the badges.

Mr. Dadd mentioned the 80 year old members, and although some thought that some members would not like the club to realise their ages, Mr. Dadd said that he thought that they should be rather proud of attaining that Grand Age. Mrs. Engel said that she also thought this and that people were not really diffident about admitting that they had reached 80 years. The question of the Club providing a Tankard to these members again came under discussion and Mrs. Engel proposed that the club should do this, and Mr. Bill Turner seconded this proposal. Mr. Saunders said that ~~the~~ members, perhaps non-drinkers, could always decline this offer if they wished. Mrs. Saunders then said that she wondered what would be done for any Ladies attaining the age of 80; and after some more remarks about the Ladies it was agreed "That a Tankard or Suitable Gift be presented to members attaining the age of 80 years" and after a vote this idea was carried. Mr. Trueman saying that it was therefore up to members to acquaint the Secretary of their age either by phone or letter and that perhaps new members could state their birthday when signing the application form.

Mr. Turner proposed and Mr. Drewett seconded that a Vote of thanks be given to Mrs. Gardner for the way in which she presented the minutes.

THE SECRETARY'S REPORT. Was then read and which it was learned that the Club had had a very successful year, membership stood at 383, the magazine was still going well and distribution very good indeed, only about 100 having to be posted each issue. Mr. Collins congratulated Mrs. Gardner on her very elucid report and efforts for the Club and that he would like his remarks contained in the minutes and suggested that Mrs. Gardner should carry on with the job. The proposal to include these remarks in the minutes was then made by Mr. Drewett and seconded by Mr. Wyatt

THE FINANCIAL REPORT was next discussed and Mr. Trueman said that he would not read it out as members must have seen it in their last issue of Signpost. We did have what seemed to be a very good balance in the Building Society. Mr. Germain then pointed out that although this did seem rather high, it should be borne in mind that we did have to keep a sum for the provision of new Assets as and when they either wore out or became necessary to have them replaced. The proposal to accept the Final Account Report was made by Mr. Wooder and seconded by Mr. Germain

NEXT CAME THE ELECTION OF A PRESIDENT. Two people being nominated, Mr. Moore and Mr. Drewett and after a vote the honour fell to Mr. Moore, the proposal by Mr. Wooder and seconded by Mrs. Ford.

After a short discussion about these proposals and it being pointed out by the Chairman that we had, according to the Rules to elect only Four it was agreed that for this year we elect these five nominated and all were satisfied.

#### ANY OTHER BUSINESS.

Mrs. Engel spoke about the possibility of further lunches for the Club, saying that she had complaints about the venue. Mrs. Gardner said that there were going to be about 85 for the luncheon to follow the meeting and she thought that in spite of complaints this was not such a bad turnout. Thinking about other venues Mr. Trueman mentioned that costs in London, a more central venue, would be very high and mentioned the Gascoigne Rooms, Mr. Wyatt spoke about the Union Jack Club at Waterloo, he had been there the evening before for a Cycling club Dinner and had found it very good, and reasonable at £7. per head and no extras, this he concluded did include Service charge and VAT. Mr. Germain asked if we would in future be having the A.G.M. as well as the Luncheon on the same Day, or only a Luncheon. Mr. Trueman asked if we carry on with Luncheon as an annual event and Mr. Drewett, Mrs. Engel & Mr. Moore also spoke. Mr. Moore saying that he thought we should put it to the meeting, and vote. Mr. Engel said that if we did that it would only reflect the feeling of those present and Mr. Trueman said that if members had any feeling about these issues they should come along to the A.G.M. as this was the time for them to air their views. Mr. Clements then proposed and Mr. Collins Seconded that we have a Luncheon and leave the venue to the Committee. Mr. Collins said that it should be in Central London, Mr. Wooder also mentioned the high costs about events in Central London the fact that we would need two rooms, one for the A.G.M. and one for the Luncheon, at the same place and this would he thought make the cost even more. After being put to the vote the result was that we have a Lunch, ~~xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx~~ in early 1983 and the venue to be arranged by the Committee, 36 voting for the proposal and 5 against. 20 abstaining.

Mr. Trueman then mentioned the reason as to the A.G.M. at Epping with the Luncheon and asked if the meeting wanted a combined A.G.M. and Luncheon, Mrs. Engel proposed a combined Luncheon and A.G.M. and Mr. Richards 2nd. and after a vote the results were 33 for the combined and 5 against.

Mr. Hill then said that those members present and sitting at the rear of the hall had difficulty in hearing what was going on at the front end and proposed that at the next A.G.M. we hired a Microphone, this was seconded by Mr. Drew and carried.

Mr. Drew then suggested that the Club started up a map library for lending maps to members for their holidays. He had some that he could offer to start this up. The idea was seconded by Mr. Turner but after a vote was defeated.

BANK HOLIDAY TOURS THEN Came up for discussion. Did we want them at Youth Hostels or B. & B. Places. Did we have them the week before or after the Bank Holidays owing to the crowded conditions at Youth Hostels. Mrs. Saunders said that she thought it a good idea for leaders of the Tours to visit places before recommending them. But the discussion came to nothing being resolved.

Mrs. Engel suggested that Members who attained the age of 80 years be elected as Honorary members of the club, but Mr. Trueman pointed out that this would mean an alteration of the rules could therefore be left to come up as a motion for the next A. .M.

Mr. Rolfe then mentioned about members who complained about the venue

Minutes of the Committee Meeting held on Saturday 30th January 1982  
at the Castle Public House, Cowcross St. EC3. 1/82

The meeting commenced at 11.30, there being 11 members present, appologies for absence were received from Mr. Trueman, Mr. Bellchamber, Mr. Collins and Mrs. Walker. Mr. Wooder took the chair in the absence of Mr. Trueman. The minutes of the meeting held on 17th October 1981 were read and all agreed them to be a true record.

The Minutes of the Special Committee meeting held at Mr. Jennings home in Theydon Bois on Sunday 8th November were also read and accepted as a true record.

Matters Arising. Mrs. Gardner said that she had a call from Mr. Bruton who said that when he went to book for the re-union for the 26th June he found that the hall had already been booked for that day by another group and she asked him to book for the 19th June, she said that she did not think it advisable to wait for the decision of the committee for this as it would then be too late, the other members all agreed to the new date and Mrs. Gardner said that she would see that it got special mention in the March issue of Signpost.

Mr. Wooder asked what booking had been received for the proposed trip to the west for Easter and Mr. Finnimore said that 8 members had booked with him, and it was felt that this was better than expected.

Mrs. Gardner read out a letter that she had received from Mr. Drew who together with his Sister had found a firm that might be willing to produce Cloth Badges for us, but after some discussion as to the cost, and especially for a small amount that we would need, it was decided not to go forward with the suggestion. Mrs. Gardner mentioning that the firms she had approached would only produce in lots of 1000 and this was considered too many.

Mr. Drew then mentioned the practice of giving Tankards to members who reached their 80th birthday, it was pointed out by Mrs. Gardner and Mr. Wooder that the subject had come up at the last AGM when it was decided that it would not be possible, for various reasons, to present tankards to all those reaching 80. Some would not accept, some did not let us know and as they do not ride now we had no way of finding out. It was, Mrs. Gardner mentioned started out by a few members clubbing together to give their friend a tankard and at the last AGM it was agreed to let it stand at that, if a few members wished to do this then they were at liberty to do so. Mr. Drew then suggested a sort of Illuminated Address but this was also not thought possible, for the same reasons, and the matter was left at that.

Mrs. Gardner then read a letter from Mr. Edgar, the Sussex Leader with regard to Aubrey Wenman, a member who is severely ill ~~but~~ and who has not remembered to pay subs, for three years now, pointing out that at a previous meeting, some two years ago she had brought this matter up and the committee had agreed to have the Signpost and Runs list sent to Mr. Wenman, and she had done this ever since, Mr. Wenman was still alive and it was agreed to keep sending the Magazine etc. Mrs. Gardner also mentioned that a magazine was still sent to Mrs. Madge Hankin, she wrote each year to see if Madge still wanted it and so far ~~the~~ the response had been "Yes" and this was still being sent to her. The meeting agreed to keep this going as long as Mrs. Hankin wanted it.

Mrs. Gardner then read some of the letters she had received, quite a few thanking us for the excellent issues of Signpost and the friendliness of the runs leaders. 9 New Members were elected.

The Financial Report was read and accepted, it being noted that we were still in a good financial position.

Mr. Wooder said that he wondered if it was worth continuing to send runs lists to those members who do not now ride, Mr. Newman, Mr. Moore and Mrs. Gardner joined in the discussion; Mr. Wooder thought that perhaps it would save the club some money if these runs lists were discontinued, Mrs. Gardner said that we could put a notice in the magazine for folk to sign if they wanted it, like the CTC do for those Life Members who still want Cycle Touring, but after thinking about this proposal it was decided that although some members do not now ride they certainly still do like to read the runs lists to remind them of former happy days, so the proposal was not carried.

Mr. Wooder said that he would definately not be standing for re-nomination for the post of President this year, he felt that there

were many members who had done a lot of work for the club and that they should have the chance to be elected.

One member of the committee asked whether the Secretary knew how many tickets Mrs. Engel had been able to sell for the Dinner on 7th February, Mrs. Gardner said that she understood from other sources that Mrs. Engel had sold about 60 or more, Mr. Moore had sold about 10 and Mrs. Gardner had about 9 so it made up a total of about 80 which was not considered too bad. Mrs. Gardner was asked to contact Mrs. Engel to see if she could arrange for some light refreshments to be available for a few folk just before the AGM, also to let Mrs. Engel know that we would be prepared to allow a Free Raffle, on the same lines as last year, this proposal being Proposed by Mr. Germain and seconded by Mr. Moore. The Secretary was also asked to arrange with Mrs. Engel to name just a few members for the Top Table. Mr. Moore asked what would be the position of Guests who arrived with members for the Dinner, but would not necessarily be admitted to the AGM and it was agreed that such Guests would be welcome to sit at the back of the room and this was welcomed by all.

Mrs. Gardner said that the Auditor had recommended that documents for the accounts could be destroyed after 5 years, this would not include Minutes or Account Books which should be kept, Mrs. Gardner said that storage space was becoming rather difficult and this would help a great deal. Everyone agreed to the suggestion by the Auditor.

Mr. Wooder then spoke about Thursday runs when no Leader turned up, and it was agreed that surely Members could lead themselves on these occasions. Mr. Newman agreed with that. Mr. Finnimore said that he wondered if two runs could be arranged on Sundays when large numbers arrived, but this was not agreed to. Mr. Drew said that when this occurred in the Luton Section he changed Pubs so as not to push out the 'Locals'.

Mr. Wooder then said that there were some members who do not ride with us although they are members and it appeared that they, together with members of other clubs, were using our runs lists to provide meeting places and getting to the Pub Lunch places well before us, this on a Sunday, so that we could not use that Pub, other members spoke about this and Mrs. Gardner said that she thought something should be worked out so as to prevent this happening, it really was bad and the Pubs were so crowded when this happened that we had to either stay outside in bad weather or find another Pub.

Mr. Pemberton had once again made out a detailed account of the present cost of Signpost and this worked out at 15.6 per copy and this was considered to be very reasonable in spite of the increase of postage but it was agreed not to bring it up at the AGM as it was felt that the club funds could well stand the next increase without having to ask members for an increase in the Subscriptions.

The Next meeting was arranged for Saturday 24th April 1982 and the meeting closed at 1.15pm.

The meeting commenced at 1205pm. There being 14 members present. Apologies for absence received from Mr. Newman. Mr. Wooder & Mr. Wyatt.

Mr. Finnimore said that he thought that a copy of the Minutes of the AGM could be sent with a later edition of the Magazine, and this would probably save time at the AGM for the reading of the minutes. 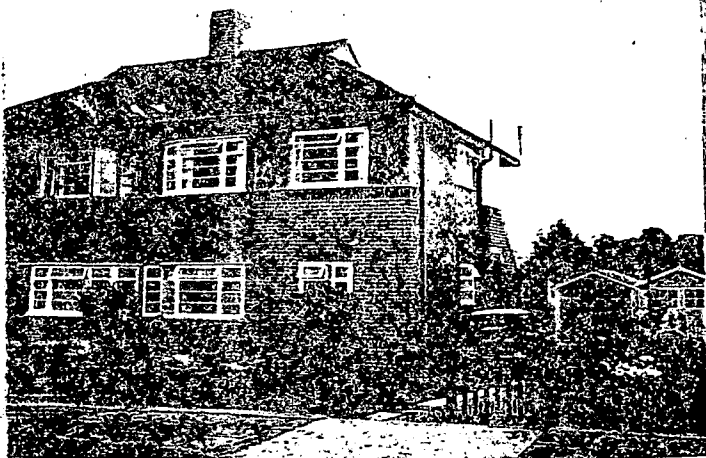

Matters Arising. Any Other Business. Mrs. Gardner asked Mr. Newman and Mrs. Ford to submit a list of their stocks as at 30th September 1982 so that she could include them in the Final Accounts for that year.
