Minutes of the <u>Annual General Meeting</u> held at the Union Jack Club on Sunday 30th January 1982.

The Meeting commenced at 10.40 with Mr. F. Trueman in the Chair.

The MINUTES of the last Annual General Meeting, held at the Treetops Hotel, Epping on Sunday 7th February 1982 were accepted as read, they having been printed in the December issue of SIGNPOST 1981. The Proposer was Mr.T.Wooder and seconder Mr.J.Wyatt.

MATTERS ARISING.

Mr.J.Jefford pointed out that we were breaking the Rules of the Club when we held the meeting at Epping as it was supposed to be 'In London' and the Chairman said that we did realise that when we had a letter from Mr.Engel pointing this out.

Mr. Engel then asked why we did not have a microphone, as was asked for at the last meeting, Mrs.Gardner said that she had written to the Manager of the Union Jack Club asking if one was available for hiring and the answer was that they did not have one and had never been asked before, other meetingshad not found it necessary. She then tried around the electrical shops in her district but could not get one at all, and then went to her local Library to look at magazines there to see if she could find any for hire but was unsuccessful. Mr. Engel said that at the last meeting it was found by some members that they could not hear what was being said and Mrs.Gardner said that she thought that most of this was due to the fact that so many members, particularly at the back of the hall were talking and having a meeting on their own, but Mr. Engel denied this.

SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Mrs. Gardner then read her report, giving details of the support for the various section runs, Bank Holiday Tours, the number of members, which at the end of September 1982 stood at 419, an alltime record for the Club. She said that we still had two founder members, two others who joined in 1951 and still four who had joined in 1952. She said that we now had 19,80 year olds and mentioned that one of these, Mr. Bob Edgar was still a section leader down in the Sussex Region. Some members had passed away, some sick ones had recovered. The Reunion had been a sussess and was arranged for 1983 on Saturday 25th June.

Signpost was still very vigourously being presented each quarter and that she thought that Mrs. Ford was doing a splendid job. About 3 of the copies were being hand delivered, saving the club a considerable amount in postage. She finished by thanking the committee for their support during the year.

Mr. Collins said that Mrs. Faith Reason was still very ill and Mr. Wooder mentioned that Mr. Good was still in hospital.

Mr. Moore proposed and Mr.Pomphrett seconded that Mrs. Gardner be congratulated on the report and that this should be included in the minutes and Mr.Collins said that it should be 'Congratulations and thanks'

FINANCIAL REPORT.

RECENTATION AND MERCHANGE MAY Mr. Hill raised the point of the cost of the Cloth Badges to members as they seemed to be at a small higher rate than the purchase price and Mrs.Gardner said that when we took into account the cost of post, telephones and fares to order them it would work out at about £2. each, and Mr. Germain pointed out that to charge the £1.83 each would cause quite a number of problems for members when ordering by post, £2. was a good sum and far easier to manage.

Mr.Cook asked what the 'Miscemaneous Expenses' of £112.30 were for as this seemd rather high, Mrs.Gardner said that she round not give details without the books being at hand and that she had thought that it was not necessary to bring them with her as she had so much else to carry but agreed to set out a detailed explaination in the next issue of Signpost and this was accepted by those interested.

Mr.Wooder then proposed and Mr.Germain seconded that we accept the

accounts as presented.

Mrs. Gardner then proposed a Motion that members quailfying at the age of 80 years for a gift from the schub; should have a certain number of years as a member and suggested that 10 years be the minimum.

Messrs. Germain, Hill, Wooder, Trueman and Mrs.Gardner also spoke, some for and some against, and Mr.Jefford said that if this was agreed to he thought that the strong element in the Committee would choose practically anywhere, and we would then be having the A.G.M. in Kent, in Herts, and even perhaps in Sussex.

After a vote was taken and the result 29 for the amendment, it was pointed out by the Chairman that this number was not a a majority of those present and was therefore lost.

Mr.C.Kersey put in a plea for all those people who, like him, were beginning to forget names of members when they met and suggested that the committee look into the possibility of providing little name disc-s that we could wear at meetings, so as toknow each other.

Mr. Germain reminded us that the Committee had spoken about the cost of providing the Magazine and said that the Subs. would not cover the cost if they were all posted, it was the fact that so many were hand delivered that we were able to keep the Subs: at their present level.

Mø. Engel then proposed that we have an A.G.M. at the UNION JACK CLUB next year, but no Luncheon. Mr. Drew suggested that the A.G.M. should be on a Saturday, and after Mr. Hill, Mr. Jefford, Mr. Finnimore, Mr. Cook and Mr. Wooder had all spoken about this Mr. Collins said that because of the small number of members attending the Luncheon it was apparent that a Luncheon was not wanted and he thought that it would be better to have luncheons on a district basis as so far these had been very successful. Mr. Davison asked if Epping was OK for a Luncheon and Mr. Kersey spoke.

After a vote of 11 for the proposal and 25 against it was lost.

Mr. Engel then proposed that we have the A.G.M. and a luncheon at the Union Jack Club and after a vote the result was 34 in favour and 3 against. so the malian was barried

Mr. Jefford asked if it could be on a Saturday to help those who lived, as he did, in an area where there was no Sunday transport, the idea was seconded by Mr. Crooke and after a vote of 14 for and 18 against was lost.

Mrs.Gardner & also said that the Interest at the Building Society had been reduced. She read a letter from Member Bert Harris who at the age of about 85 had applied for another five years commuted membership and said that this gave her hope for the future.

SICK MEMBERS,







Thank you for your letter asking for details of the 40+ CC. I am sending herewith the current runs list and hope that you will be able to join up with us on some of the runs.

The general rule is that we meet at the elevenses venues, then ride together to lunch, usually taken at a pub where we can get a drink to have with our sandwiches. Then together again or in twos and threes, each rider dropping off as the most useful turning for home comes along. Those who live at an awkward distance from the elevenses places ride out and meet the others at lunch.

The membership fee is £1. each per year. £1.25 for Husband & Wife. After one year full membership one can commute for 5 years for £4. Husband & Wife for £5. Anyone joining after 30th June in any year just pays half the fee for that year. An application for membership form is enclosed, but do not commit yourself yet, come along and have a ride or two, see how you get on and whether you like us first. Just turn up at the meeting place and make yourself known to the leader, I am sure you will be made welcome.

We produce our own magazine "Signpost", which goes out free to all members each quarter. It is made up of items from Members, the stencils done by one of the Ladies, printed by one of the Chaps and over half of the copies are hand delivered, a truly club effort.

We have Bank-Holiday tours, usually based at Youth Hostels, but we do not promote any racing, though we do have in our midst quite a number of Members who, in their more youthful days did race, true they do not now go as far or as fast as they once used to but they do still ride regularly for their own pleasure. Although we are the 40+ we are mainly in the 60+ region and do have many members in their 70s so I am sure you would be OK with us for pace and distance.

Members can, and often do, ride with more than one section, you will see this from the runs list. If you are in any area where there is a run you will be welcome to join in and we all look forward to

meeting you.
