Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held at the Union Jack Club on
2nd February 1985. Sandell St. SE1

Meeting commenced at 11.15 am. with appologies for absence from
Mr.W.Groom. Mr.C.Cheesman. Mr.P.Date.Mrs.G.Collins.Mr.J.Wyatt,
Mr.A.Fielden.Mr.E.Pomphrett & Mr.W.Hill.

Mr. W.Turner was in the Chair.

The Minutes of the previous AGM held on 4th February 1984 having
been printed in December issue of Signpost, were accepted as read
and there were no matters arising.

The Secretary's Annual Report was read by The President Mr.W.S.Moore
because of the Secretary's difficulty in being unable to speak.

Mr.A.Cook said that the Club should congratulate The Secretary on
her report and all agreed.

Mr.Moore then presented Mrs.Gardner with a framed photograph taken
of the presentation to her of the Plaque giving details of her two
End to End rides in 1983 and 1984. The Presentation having taken
place at the Eastern Section Christmas Dinner at Treetops Hotel on
6th December last.

Mr.Turner the Chairman then congratulated the Secretary on her effort-s
and read her letter of resignation from duties of Secretary and
Treasurer. This was accepted with reluctance.

The Financial Report had been printed in December issue of Signpost
and there were no queries, all agreed to accept this report.

Next came the election of a President. Mr.Moore being elected.
Prop: by Mr.Jefford and seconded by ~~XXX~~ Mr.R.Gunn and approved by all.

The election of Chairman resulted in Mr.W.Turner being proposed by
Mr.Moore and seconded by all present and he accepted.

Mrs.Gardner having resigned as Secretary & Treasurer it came to the
meeting to elect a successor. It was agreed that the jobs be now
split up into two and the election of Secretary came first.

Mr.Turner then read out a list of items that the new secretary would
be expected to do, there were so many that it was agreed again to
now make two jobs of it.

Mrs.Cheesman said she would be willing to help out with some typing
but could not offer to take on the whole job. It was mentioned that
Eva Paine had offered to type stencils for runs lists but as she was
not present and had not offered by writing to Mrs.Gardner it was left
as unresolved at that point. No one came forward to take on the job
of Secretary.

Mrs.Card then offered to take on the job of membership Secretary &
Treasurer and Mr.Wooder said that he felt that these two jobs should
be taken on together. Mr.Jefford said that he felt that Mrs.Card
should only deal with money. After some discussion it was agreed to
accept Mrs.Card's offer.

The point was then mentioned by the Chairman that we still needed
a new Secretary. Mrs.Cheesman said again that she could help with a
job of typing but no more, she felt that she had enough to do at
home. But if she could do some small item that would relieve the
Secretary of something she would help. Eddie Engel then asked what
were the jobs that the Secretary had to do now that Mrs.Card had
taken on the Treasurers Job. The Mr.Vesper offered to do the job for
one year, and have it reviewed then and all were in favour of that
offer. Mrs.Gardner and Mr.Engel were both in favour of ~~XXX~~ a
meeting of all those offering to do something as soon as possible.
Mr.Wooder mentioned the offer of Eva Paine as runs secretary and
said he would be willing to do that if Eva's offer did not come to
anything. It was left like that, the Treasurer and Secretary and
all offering should get together to sort out what they each should
do.

Mrs Card says that this is not structurally correct -

The election of other officers then went on and the results were as follows:-

ST.ALBANS. Mr.Moore offered to do the programme of runs but could not lead, but Mr.Peter Hutchins had offered to lead and all agreed to this arrangement.

EAST.HERTS.Mr.Hill was not present because he was at that moment in hospital but was willing to carry on as secretary, Mr.Moore Proposed and Mrs.Gardner seconded that.

STEVENAGE & NORTH HERTS.Mr.Collins was not willing to do the job any more but thanked all of his section for their support. He proposed Mr.Hicks and this was seconded by all.

EASTERN THURSDAY "A" Mr.Scrutton was proposed by Mrs.Engel and seconded by all. Mr.Scrutton accepting the job.

EASTERN THURSDAY "B" Mr.Vesper offered to carry on as secretary and his offer was seconded by Mrs.Engel. all agreed.

EASTERN SUNDAY. Although Mr.Pomphrett was not present he had written to the Secretary saying that he was willing to carry on as Secretary for that section and this was seconded by Mrs Engel.

NORTHERN SUNDAYS. Mrs.Cheesman said that she and Mr.Cheesman were willing to carry on and everyone agreed to this.

SOUTHEND THURSDAY. Mr. Lydall had sent a message that he was willing to do a runs list for each quarter and this was accepted.

SOUTHERN WEDNESDAYS & SOUTHERN SUNDAYS. Although Mr.Wyatt was not present he had agreed to take over the two jobs, he already did the Wednesdays and had now taken over Mrs.Gardners Sundays. Everyone agreed to this.

SUSSEX. Mrs.Gardner had written a message that since the death of Bob Edgar, Mr.Jim Trenowden had taken over the section and was willing to act at secretary for them down south. everyone accepted this offer.

LUTON & DUNSTABLE. MRS. BAZELY SAID that she was quite willing to carry on with that job and all agreed.

EDITOR FOR SIGNPOST. Everyone suggested that Rose Ford should carry on with the job and she agreed.

AUDITOR. Mrs.Gardner had made a note of the fact that the present Auditor Mr.M.Thorne would not be willing to act if the new Treasurer lived north of the river thames, he thought that the Auditor and Treasurer should live reasonably near to each other, Mrs.Card said that from where she lived it was not really far from Dartford, where Mr. Thorne lived, but after some discussion Mr.C.Kersey offered with limitations as to the fact that he might not be able to do the job away from his home and Mrs. Card said that she would travel to Mr.Kersey. So everyone agreed that Mr.Kersey be the Auditor.

PRINTER FOR SIGNPOST. It was immediately suggested that Mr.Newman should carry on with the job that he does so well, Mr. Newman said he would but that at the same time he did not wish to 'Hog all the Limelight' (General laughter when he said that) and all agreed that he carry on.

EXTRA MEMBERS FOR THE COMMITTEE. Some discussion arose about the number that we should have. Mr.Wooder proposed 4, Mr. Engel then said that the Rule books were not up to date on this matter. Mrs.Gardner said that at the 1983 AGM it was agreed to alter the rule ~~to be~~ after a motion from Mr.Finnimore, it was eventually altered to read 'to delete the word 'Four'.

Mrs.Gardner said that when the rules had been altered in any way she had always had the alteration put in the next edition of signpost and that if members did not then alter their rule books then they would be 'out of date' (The alteration to the Rule is in the minutes of the AGM held on 30th January 1983)

Eventually the following extra members were elected:-

Mr.Wooder. Prop. Mr.Bridson. 2nd. Mr.Kersey.

Mr.Stevens. Prop. Mr.Scrutton. 2nd. Mrs.Engel.

Mr.Newman. Prop. Mrs.Engel. 2nd Mr.Vesper.

Mr.Rumball. Prop. Mr.Wooder. 2nd. Mr.Kersey.

Mr. Newman said that he had always been to the Committee Meetings as Ex Officio, But Mrs. Engel said that this would ^{now} make it Official. (Here I would like to add that I always asked Mr. Newman to attend because there were often items to discuss regarding the printing, purchasing of materials for printing and often items concerning the duplicator that had to be discussed and it was always useful to have Mr Newman there for this reason.)

(Actually the Editor for Signpost is not officially on the committee but I have always invited her to attend ^{and} because, again there are often items to discuss that affect her job)

Mr. Jefford brought up the question of Pubs that are beginning to refuse us admission to eat our sandwiches and he thought that it would be a good idea if the runs list showed which Pubs would welcome us and which can supply food. It was pointed out that Mr. Vesper already did this on his list.

Mr. Vesper said that this could happen at any time, Pubs changed hands and then we found ourselves refused. Mr. Drew said that he used to make a prior visit to a Pub to find out what their feelings were. Mr. Collins said that in his group they did try to use Pubs that supplied Meals in the winter and those that welcomed us with sandwiches in the summer and this had worked very well. Mr. Turner also agreed that this did happen when Pubs changed hands and that in any case we should always enquire first.

Mrs. Engel then produced a painting that had been done by Mr. Cook, some time ago for Jack Ivory, it was in the north of Scotland and had come back to Mr. Cook upon the death of Jack Ivory, Mr. Cook then asked Mrs. Gardner if she would accept the painting as a token of gratitude from them all, for her courageous ride from Cape Wrath to Dover to raise funds for the research into Motor Neurone Disease, and then handed the picture to Mrs. Gardner, who thanked everyone through the Chairman.

Mr. Hill being in hospital, Mr. Moore then put forward a request from Mr. Hill that he would like to see members re-imbursed their expenses when attending meetings for committee at some distance from home. Mr. Vesper said that he thought that this was unnecessary.

Mr. Jefford suggested and Mr. Wooder seconded that expenses should be offered, and if refused they could then be accepted as a donation to funds. Mr. Cook suggested a set sum but after some discussion this was not thought to be a good idea. After a vote for the adoption of the idea which resulted in a majority accepting, Mr.

Engel said that surely the re-imburement to members should be 'If they would accept' Mr. Turner said that it would be up to the member concerned to accept, otherwise it would be left and Mr. Engel agreed. Mrs. Bazely spoke about the cost of posting signpost, did it really

over the cost, it seemed to amount up to almost the whole of the Sub: to the club. Mr. Newman then gave details of the costs of producing Signpost and said that really it was good value, and that as so many were hand delivered, he did not feel that it would be right to ask for donations for the postage or to increase the Subs: just for those people whose magazine was posted.. Mr. Engel suggested that a note could be put in Signpost about this and that members could then donate if they wished.

The Chairman then read a Motion from Mr. Merrett in which he complained about an article in Signpost that concentrated on racing, he had said that the 40+ was a club for leasurly riding and that Signpost should not be used by the Racing Fraternity. Mrs. Engel then said that she felt that some of the racing element were trying to take over, they turned up for runs in racing gear with their bikes stripped down and she thought that this was not an encouragement to older members to come along for a leasurly ride. There was a general discussion in which someone suggested that we do not have any racing articles in Signpost and Mr. Wooder supported this view. Proposing it and Mr. Drew seconded this idea. The vote that we do not print any articles about racing or events or results of events was carried by all. Mr. Jefford said and Mr. Engel supported him when he said that he felt that the Editor was being conned. Mrs. Ford then said that she had only printed the article because it did mention some 40+ members.

The Meeting closed at 1.20pm with a vote of thanks to the Chairman.

THIS MIGHT SOMEHOW KEEP OUT THE RACING ELEMENT WHO WERE EVIDENTLY CREEPING IN. MAYBE IT WOULD BE FOUND OUT FROM COMMITTEE MEMBERS IF THE PROPOSED NEW MEMBER WAS JUST ANOTHER RACING PERSON. MRS.ENGEL WAS EVIDENTLY VERY SINCERE IN HER REMARKS ABOUT THE RACING ELEMENT TRYING TO 'TAKE OVER' I SUGGEST THAT THE NEW COMMITTEE DO GIVE THIS SOME THOUGHT. I KNOW THAT IT WOULD SEEM THAT PERHAPS WE WERE TRYING TO BE A BIT SELECTIVE, BUT WE HAD TO DO SOMETHING TO KEEP UP THE SPIRIT THAT WAS WITH US WHEN CECIL COOKE FIRST STARTED THE CLUB. THERE ARE PLENTY OF RACING CLUBS FOR THEM, LET US KEEP TO OUR ORIGINAL INTENTION OF A "SOCIAL AND CYCLING CLUB IN LONDON AND THE HOME COUNTIRS FOR THE OVER FORTIES"

MINUTES OF MEETING HELD IN LONDON ON SATURDAY 19th JANUARY 1985.

When we arrived at the Castle Public House at 11am to 12 am we found it closed up, upon investigation we were informed that it was now in new hands, having been taken over on the previous Wednesday. The new Linencee said that he was told by the outgoing licencee that letters had been sent to associations who had booked rooms but Mrs.Gardner said that up to that day she had not received one. Mr.Scrutton set off along Cowcross Street to see if he could find a room in another Pub but without success. We then decided to ask the proprietor of the cafe at the corner of Cowcross St and Farringdon Rd, if we could use part of his Cafe to have a meeting, explaining the circumstances, we all agreed to have tea or coffee and he agreed to let us use a large corner of the cafe.

Our meeting then began about 12.20

The Minutes of the meeting held on 6th October were dispensed with as it was felt that it would be rather too much for the Proprietor to have more noise than was necessary.

Matters arising therefore did not take place.

It was decided to only see to matters that really could not be left out and Mrs.Gardner sent round the usual Financial Report which was read and accepted by all. It was a 100% turnout of members.

The question of the impending retirement of Mrs.Gardner from the position of Secretary and Treasurer was discussed at length. The general feeling being that as we should not be able to get anyone to take over the whole business that Mrs.Gardner now attended to it would be a wise idea to opt for a General Secretary, Treasurer and also a Membership Secretary, this being proposed by Mr.Wooder and seconded by Mr. Moore. And this would be put up at the AGM on 2nd February.

It was suggested that in future members pay their Subs. to their respective Runs Secretaries who would then pass them on to the New Treasurer. It was however pointed out that this was already being done by very many of the members. ✓

It was also suggested that New Members should themselves contact the New Membership Secretary when they join. ✓

A general discussion on these two items ensued and it was agreed to bring them up at the AGM.

Mr.Wooder did however offer to do the jobs for a time if no one was found when the AGM was held, and his offer was accepted.

Mr.Newman was asked about the condition of the stencil of the magazine covers. He said that it was now really worn out. He had been in touch with two people regarding a replacement, one was on silk and could be printed by another person, the other one was quite able to be used on our duplicator and he would be willing to print the covers himself, this would save a considerable sum of money. Everyone accepted Mr.Newman's offer saying that it would make rather more work for him, but he said, well "My successor can worry about that" The new cover would of course only be in one colour and this was agreed by all to be acceptable.

Mr.Wooder asked about having the Duplicate overhauled but Mr.Newman was not in favour of this. There was a part that now had to be either repaired or replaced, he had made enquiries and found that it would cost say £20 to £30 and that he was quite able to refit the part to the duplicator. Mr.Newman was instructed to get the replacement and the Club would pay the bill.

A letter of resignation ~~was~~ from Mrs.Gardner was read by the Chairman. Her resignation was accepted with regret, but all present agreed that Mrs.Gardner had been a splendid Secretary & Treasurer and it would be almost impossible to replace her. Mr.Collins said that the committee's thanks for her work should be recorded in the minutes, and everyone agreed to that.

Mr. Hill suggested that it may be a good idea to pay fares to those members who attend the committee meeting from out of the "Free Transport" areas and after some discussion it was agreed that he bring this up as 'Any Other Business' at the AGM. Mrs. Gardner saying that the AGM Agenda Stencil was already done because she had not received any Motions by 7th January

The date for the Re-Union was agreed to be 27th June at the Rest and Welcome at Haultwick, same place as last year as this was found to be well supported. 27/6/85

The date of the next committee meeting was left over to be agreed with the new committee at the AGM. It would have to be sometime in early May to keep up our four yearly meetings. ???

Mr. Woode then proposed and Mrs. Gardner seconded that the cost of the tea & coffee and use of the Cafe for this meeting should be paid out of club funds and all agreed to that. X

Mrs. Gardner asked that if anyone had items for inclusion in the Club Album would they let her have them so that she could have them ready before she passes the job over to her successor ?

The meeting closed about 1.30 pm with a vote of thanks to the Chairman.

COMMITTEE MEETING 30, MARCH, 1985.
BETHNAL GREEN CENTRE.

Proceedings commenced at 11.10am with apologies for absence from Mrs D. Bazley, Mr, H, Rumball, Mr, C, Cheeseman, and Mr, W, Moore. I added my apologies for not giving more notice of the Meeting to those concerned. Mr W, Hill informed us that our President, and Mr, P, Hutchins, had not received any notification at all. The former I cannot understand as I distinctly remember looking up the address for the envelope. The latter is indicated on the "List of Officers Elected" at the A.G.M 2/2/85 as not being on the Committee, and so no notice was sent to him.

The MINUTES of the meetings of 6/10/84 and 19/1/85 were read and accepted by all present as a true record.

MATTERS ARISING. Mr W, Newman informed us that he had repaired the duplicating machine. One of the driving bands had broken, and when he had enquired about a replacement, he was advised to purchase two bands as to use one new and one old together would lead to uneven loading and further trouble. He has retained the old sound one as a standby. He also reported that the new arrangements for him to print the covers of Signpost are now satisfactory, and no problems are envisaged. (minutes 19/1/85 refer). All present were very pleased with the copies seen, and were truly thankful for his efforts on our behalf. There were no other matters arising.

MRS R. FORD, EDITOR SIGNPOST REPORTED SOME TROUBLE WITH HER CYCLOTYPE WRITER (INDISTINCT LETTERS FOR STENCIL CUTTING) AND REQUESTED THAT THE COMMITTEE AUTHORISE A REPAIR. ALL AGREED - BILL TO TREASURER.

CORRESPONDENCE. Mr W, Bush to the effect that he did not wish to receive a presentation on his 80th birthday on the grounds that he had not been active in the 40+ for some time, and thus did not feel qualified. (a suitable card full of signatures was sent on our behalf by John Scrutton).

Mr V, Stewart to me requesting a Book Token in lieu of a Tankard. (This was presented by me on behalf of the Club at Paslow Common plus a similar card by John Scrutton), 26/3/85.

NEW MEMBERS. Twenty new applications for membership were read out, and all were accepted. At this point there was some discussion on the acceptance of new members, the outcome of which was:- that prospective new members should be invited to have a few runs with the Club, where possible, before being given an application form. This to ensure that the 40+ is what they really want, and to indicate to us that they are likely to be bona-fide members and not just book&badge members (who often do not renew after a year or two). Mr W. Hill mentioned that this could perhaps present difficulties for outlying applicants. This was accepted, but the feeling of those present was that, ideally they should be at least seen by a Runs Sec' ~~xx~~ first, as this is a "Cycling Club" (this with all due respect to Members who are no longer able to ride).

Although not mentioned at this point, I think that our Founder envisaged London and the Home Counties as ^{the} catchment area.

The FINANCIAL REPORT was presented by the Treasurer/Membership Sec', passed round for perusal and accepted as satisfactory. Mrs Card had encountered no particular difficulties other than a late caller at her home for "payment of subs"- she could have well done without this.

The NEW WORKING ARRGTs seem to be effective so far as can be ascertained. They are dependant on communication by those concerned, and a matter of some relative importance could quite easily be missed. No particular difficulty has been reported so far.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS. The Gen Sec' asked those present to consider the possibility of conferring Honorary Membership on Grace Gardner in recognition of her services to the Club as she is unable to discharge the duties of an active officer (an offer ~~of~~ of, say, President would not be feasible). Mr Hill then said that it was often the case, elsewhere, that this situation had been met by conferring the office of Vice President. After some consideration it was felt to be ~~acceptable~~ acceptable, and that no further time should elapse in acting (the Rules of the Club ~~would~~ would seem to embrace such a contingency), and the Chairman proposed such a move and this was agreed by all present, to be attended to without delay.

The date of the next Committee Meeting was fixed for 29/6/85 and the venue to be as now. It is considered satisfactory for such purposes, but I expressed some doubt as to its use for the A.G.M. Access would seem to be more difficult for those who have to travel far, and perhaps not very well acquainted with inner London.

Mr Hill mentioned that our President had indicated to him that he would like to be kept informed of Members ~~reaching~~ ~~reaching~~ reaching 80 years of age, illness or death of same. This information usually comes to hand often purely by chance, subject to delay, and possibly not factual by the time it reaches Club officers.

Mr Scrutton presented a proposal by Mr D. Brunwin for the introduction of a 100 mile Randonnee for the 40+ on an annual basis, if agreed the first to take place in July 1985. Mr Brunwin would it is understood organise in this instance. After some discussion, it was agreed by most of the Committee that it was not a bad idea, and some mention will be made in June Signpost. Mr Brunwin had also suggested the possibility of car assisted runs further afield from our usual haunts. I understand that one is already listed.

There being no other business the meeting closed at 1.0pm (later than intended).

COMMITTEE MEETING. 29, JUNE, 1985.

BETHNAL GREEN CENTRE

Proceedings commenced at 11.20am with apologies from the following for absence:- Mr & Mrs Cheesman, Mr Hicks, Mr Wooder, Mr W. Newman(holidays). Mr L. Pomphrett, Mr H. Rumball(work). Mrs D. Bazley(travelling problems).

The Minutes of the meeting of 30 March, 1985 were read and accepted by all present as a true record, and were then accordingly signed by the Chairman, Mr W. Turner, who had attended in spite of being on crutches as a result of a road accident. All present were truly thankful for this effort on his part.

In Matters Arising from those minutes, Mr Newman was not in attendance to give any details about production of Signpost, but there are apparently no particular difficulties at the moment. It would seem that distribution is the biggest problem. Mrs Ford, Editor of Signpost reported that the Club Typewriter in her charge has now been repaired and is now working satisfactorily. It was not just as easy as that as she had to return it to the repairer once as unsatisfactory in action. Mrs Ford waived the extra expense of fares/carriage etc in favour of the Club, for which we were all grateful.

The Gen' Secretary reported that Mrs Gardner had accepted the Hon^{ific} Presidency, and that the addition will be made in typescript on Club notepaper. Mr W. Hill reminded us that consideration should now be given to conferring similar Honour on other members who have given sterling service to the Club. This, in principle, was agreed but it was felt to be a matter for further discussion as to how frequently this should be done. In the case of Mrs Gardner, it was felt that no time should be lost.

Our President, Mr W. Moore is still rightly perturbed about the lack of information he receives concerning members who become ill, 80 years of age, die, or are subject to accident etc. With reference to the penultimate paragraph of the minutes of 30/3/85, the matter at present relies on chance information and assumption. The only answer to this is a fail/safe reporting procedure. The Gen' Secretary will set this up in the following manner:- He will initiate a list (for want of a better description) of current cases, to be examined every couple of weeks or so, and where necessary, make enquiries. As alteration occurs, this would be forwarded to the President to note and forward to the Membership Sec' to do likewise and return to the Gen' Sec'. It is important that these details are written down as they come to notice in view of our advancing years (some) and the onset of forgetfulness.

The sources of information would ideally be the Runs Sec's, and the diligence of those in their Sections. Currently in the matter of imminent 80th birthdays, the Membership Sec' is an unfailing source of information, and Mrs Gard does provide this on paper well in advance. This could circulate to the President via the Gen'Sec', both to note, and return to the Membership Sec' for file.

Correspondence consisted of a letter from Mrs Gardner accepting the post of Hon' Vice President. She said that she is still "battling on" and still hopeful of being able to speak again some day. Reply sent 22/5/85. Another letter was received from Mr C. Merrett on the subject of ailing members being forgotten and suggesting that we have a Welfare Officer (one of the Committee perhaps?). As a first step, the final paragraph of "Matters Arising", (these Minutes) could hopefully meet this contingency. The Gen' Sec' should be able to cope with most of this. Finally a letter from the Victoria C.C. (Len Clisby) with an offer of the use of their Club Hut for our Slide Show this year. Subsequent agreement reached on 19th Oct 1985 as being suitable to both Clubs.

There were 9 new members accepted and duly voted in. This is down on our usual intake, but nothing serious.

The Financial Report presented by the Treasurer/Memb'Sec' was passed round for perusal and accepted. No particular difficulties reported.

The next Committee Meeting was fixed for 5th Oct, 1985, same time, same venue.

The current venue is now confirmed as being quite suitable but one or two members of the Committee reluctant to travel there. Why? It is quite accessible, cheap, and reasonably comfortable. We did consider approaching the Union Jack Club for a room, but that would not solve any travel problems (might create more), and would certainly be more expensive.

The A.G.M. was fixed for 1st Feb, 1986, 11.0am - 1.0pm at the Union Jack Club and a letter confirming the booking is on file. The Leatham Room which we have had for some time is no longer available, and a room of similar capacity and cost was offered and accepted.

The Club Slide Show, "Correspondence", (these Minutes) refer.

No concrete news about an Xmas Lunch. As Treetops has closed down, the Roebuck at Buckhurst Hill has been suggested as a possible venue. Our President is arranging one on the Northern side and this should be noted.

In Any Other Business, the Gen'Sec' confirmed that the "Castle" in Cowcross St E.C. is definitely no longer available, and that there is little hope of anything else in that area.

The rather sudden death of Edie Trueman highlighted the need for greater attention to members who are not seen out riding. This was first learned of at the Reunion, Haultwick, and presented the Gen'Sec' with some difficulty in getting details of the Funeral etc. This was finally overcome with the assistance of Mrs O. Saunders. A wreath from the 40+ was arranged, the Gen'Sec' will attend, and information has been passed around the Club for others who may wish to attend.



COMMITTEE MEETING. 5th OCTOBER, 1985.

BETHNAL GREEN CENTRE

Proceedings commenced at 11.20am as one or two members had travelling difficulties. Apologies for non attendance were recieved from:- Mr W.Hill(sick), Mr W.Turner, Mr T.Wooder (hols) Mr C,Cheesman(business). Our President, Mr W.Moore substituted Mr Turner as Chairman in this instance.

The Minutes of the meeting held on 29th June, 1985 were read out to those present, and all were agreed that they were an accurate record of that meeting. These minutes were then signed as approved by the Chairman.

In Matters Arising from those minutes, it was confirmed by all present that this venue is entirely suitable and that we are fortunate in having the facility. The Chairman thought it unlikely that members from outlying Sections(Luton, Southend, Sussex etc) would attend because of apparent (but not real) travelling difficulties in Inner London.. It was generally agreed that as far as we can tell, we cannot improve on the position to make us more accessible.

The dates of the Xmas/Annual Lunches were confirmed as follows:- St Albans Sect'n. The Gosling Stadium, Welwyn Garden City, 29th Oct, 1985. Eastern & Northern Sect'n. "La Taverna" Epping. 5th Dec, 1985. Both 12.00 for 1.0. Price £6.50.

Mr J, Scrutton raised the matter of the difficulty and expense that Mr Newman has to face when distributing "Signpost" and asked if it would not be possible to have one other person or a group to be responsible for this. All present agreed that Mr Newman should be relieved of this burden, the Gen' Sec' having put this to him some time ago. In commenting on the matter, Mr Newman agreed in principle, but reminded us that whoever did it would need a car and suitable storage space. It so happened that a Motion had been submitted for the A.G.M. on this very subject, by Mrs E.Paine to the effect that - All copies of the Mag' should be posted by 2nd class Mail, the cost to be offset by an increase of 50p PA in subscriptions. In support, some instances were quoted where complete failure in delivery was experienced, but, it is stressed not as a result of Mr Newman's arrangements.

In conjunction with the above mentioned Motion, Mrs Paine further moved that the Club invest in a reconditioned electrically powered duplicator to relieve Mr Newman of the need to turn the handle as now. Mr Newman was a little doubtful about this, having in mind the possibility of electrical failure which he might not be able to deal with, and the further possibility of a power assisted "tear -up" should things become dis-arranged. He has promised me a report on the "pros and cons"

With regard to the enquiry made by the Gen'Sec' concerning the feasibility of breaking the Club up into Sections with their own officers, finance etc(as provided for in the present club rules), on the matter being raised again, the whole Committee were opposed to this, and in spite of rapidly growing membership, the Club will continue as now.

General enquiry was made regarding Grace Gardner, and Mr Wyatt confirmed that she is getting on as well as can be expected, putting on weight, happier at home, and being well cared for.

No problems have appeared in the new system of keeping a check on members who become ill or have accidents etc, The response from the President, and right through the membership has been good. The system is not yet complete insofar as a list has not circulated between the Gen'Sec', President, and Membership Sec'. Experience may show that this might not be necessary.

Correspondence was as follows:-

A letter from our President informing the Club of the passing of Bill Frankum on 11 Sept'1985 at the age of 80 years. The 40+ were represented at his cremation, and flowers were laid. A letter of condolence was sent to his next-of-kin, a Daughter, who replied with a letter of thanks. A further letter updated information on the progress of Alec Bailey, Ron Gunn, and Nobby Townsley.

A letter from the Event Sec' of an E.C.C.A 10 mile Time Trial, thanking the 40+ for assistance in running this event on 31, Aug 1985. It seems that the event could not have taken place if those of us who did this had not been willing or able to do so. A suitable reply was sent with a request for permission to publish the text in the next issue of "Signpost". This was gladly given by phone. The Committee agreed to this step.

A nice letter of appreciation was received from Eddie Saunders thanking the Club for His Presentation at the Reunion.

With regard to the Financial Report, Mrs Card reported some difficulty in striking a balance, this apparently being due to a difference in the system now adopted as compared to that previously used. None of the officers in possession of Club property have provided a list of items held and a statement of their estimated value, and all agreed that this must be done before the next meeting. The balance as presented was accepted and signed.

No comments were made on the A.G.M. itself, and motions received so far are as follows:- From Mr F.S.Wright, Eastern Sect'n, That the 40+ affiliate with the C.T.C. as a club to obtain third party insurance cover. There were also vague allusions to other matters which could not be clarified. Mr Wright in his motion stated that these matters were not for comment by the Committee.

From Mrs E.Paine, Eastern Sect'n, two motions as described in Matters Arising (para 3&4) these minutes.

The date and time of the next Committee meeting was agreed and will take place on 11th Jan 1986, same time, same place.

Any other Business. Mrs Card, Membership Sec'y/Treasurer raised a point concerning her acceptance of this post at the last A.G.M. In the Minutes of that meeting, "rs Gardner, then Club Secretary, states quite clearly that:- Mrs Card then offered to take the job of Membership Secretary/Treasurer.

Mr Wooder felt that the two jobs should go together. Mr Jefford said that he felt that Mrs Card should only deal with money.

After some discussion, it was agreed to accept Mrs Card's offer.

Mrs Card stated that she did not say that she would do the now combined jobs. To the best of recollection, all present Did think that she had accepted them. The Gen' Sec'y then asked her if she wished to relinquish them and the answer was "No".

Possibly the interjection by Mr Jefford may have confused the issue. For what it is worth, the paragraph concerned was endorsed and signed by the Gen' Sec'y.

There being no other business, the Meeting closed at 12.45pm.
