ABRIDGED MINUTES OF THE FORTY-PLUS C.C.'S A.G.M. ON 31st JANUARY 1987

The proceedings commenced on time with Mr. W.Turner in the chair.

1. Minutes of the previous A.G.M. having been published in Signpost on a separate sheet were taken as read.

2. There were no matters arising.

3. GENERAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

Most of the last 12 months' activities had been reported in Signpost, but since then we had heard the news of Grace Gardner's passing after putting up a tremendous fight against a terrible disease; a very brave lady who will always hold a place in our hearts. Moves are afoot to form new sections by the Shaws in Marlow and by Wilf Groom in Cambridgeshire. It had been a year of steady and continuing progress.

4. MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY/TREASURER'S REPORT

The membership rose from 602 at the end of 1985 to 641 a year later. There were now 82 new members; 14 died including East Herts Secretary Bill Hill and Fred Drewett who had been a member for 34 years. Two members were killed on the road. 20 members attained the age of 80, making at least 54 octogenarians. The response for Post Codes had been good. The financial Report was accepted as set out in Signpost.

Mr. Godfrey was proposed and seconded but after a confused discussion it was thought there could be only 4 committee members.

7. MOTIONS FOR DISCUSSION AND VOTING

1. Proposed by Mrs. M.K.Wright, seconded by Mr. J.Wright that the office of Signpost Distributor be officially adopted. This had been discussed as out of order as Mr. Stevens had been concerned that if this was augmented a place on the committee would be lost for a year. The point was cleared up by Mr. E.Engel who said that this would not be an ex officio post. This proposal was then unanimously accepted.

2. Proposed by Mr. E.Vesper and seconded by Mr. W.Turner that the practice of presenting tankards or equivalent Book Tokens to members attaining the age of 80 years be re-introduced, the cost to be met from Club Funds, and the qualifications to be as before. There was no voting on this because of:-

3. Proposed by Mr. E.Engel that if a return of gifts to 80 year old members is to be made, then the length of membership to be required should at least be 20 years...To get over this Mr. Gray suggested an amendment to Motion 2, deletingfrom Club Funds, which was seconded by Mr. E.Groom and accepted.

Mr. E.Engel withdrew 20 years, saying he would find 15 years acceptable.
10 years was then put to the vote 10 for 27 against

The question then arose as to what would happen if members completed 15 years after their 80th birthday. Mr. J.Stevens and Mr. D.Brunwin seconded, 'That Tankards or equivalent Book Tokens be presented to members on completion of 15 years continuous membership providing they had passed their 80th birthday.'

8. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Mr. Brunwin announced he was willing to organise the '100' on 16th July. Mr. W.Turner suggested producing Sponsorship Forms for members to raise money for research of Motor Neurone Disease for use of members riding in this event. Consensus was against this, but individuals could make it a sponsored ride.
The meeting closed at 1.10 p.m.(Full minutes can be seen on request at A.G.M.)

2. Proposed by Mr.E.Vesper, seconded by Mr.W.Turner that the practice of presenting tankards or equivalent Book tokens to Members attaining the age of 80 years be re-introduced, the cost to be met from Club Funds. Any qualifications required to be the same as before the practice ceased. It was felt difficult to vote on this as a completely separate issue from Motion 3: Proposed by Mr. E. Engel, that if the return of gifts to 80 year members is to be made, that the length of membership to be required to qualify be at least 20 years. Mr. J. Gray suggested a way out of the predicament would be to make an amendment to Motion 2 deleting from "...from Club Funds", this was seconded by Mr. E. Groom, and was generally accepted.

COMMITTEE MEETING JANUARY 10th 1987

Mr. W. Turner took the chair.

1. October 18th minutes read.

2. Matters Arising

Mrs. E. Engel reported Mr. T. Groom had agreed to be President. Mrs. K. Card pointed out that the honour was to be offered jointly to Mr. and Mrs. Groom. Mrs. E. Engel said both Grooms were delighted when she spoke to them and she felt a joint Presidency would be equally acceptable and she would ascertain if this was so.

A Vote of Thanks was passed to Mrs. E. Engel for her work on a very successful Dinner at Epping. Another Vote of Thanks was passed to Doug Brunwin for his administration of the '100'.

Correspondence & Treasurer's Report

Mrs. K. Card had had correspondence from Mr. Wilf Groom regarding his endeavours to get a Section going in Cambridge, he has advertised in local cycle shops and is rather hopeful of success. Mr. B. Moore expressed concern as to whether this would draw riders away from other Sections, but as the prospective runs will probably be on Wednesday, it was felt that any disadvantage would be largely nullified, so the Committee gave the venture their blessing. Mrs. K. Card stated Membership had increased from 602 in December 1986 to 641 a year later. Since the October Meeting there had been 17 applications for membership, all were accepted. Mrs. K. Card reported she had ordered Cloth, Metal and Transfer Badges to a cost of £619, which although inflation had taken its toll our prices would not need to go up, although she felt a rise of 5p in the Metal Badge making it 80p would simplify monetary transactions, after discussion it was agreed that all prices would remain unchanged.

5. A.G.M. Business

Mrs. E. Engel read out a letter she had received from Mr. Ralph Wilkinson stating he was against presentation of Tankards, an 82 year old had suggested that a birthday card to an 80 year old was sufficient acknowledgement. An inconclusive debate ended for as the chairman stated the final analysis and decision can only be made at the A.G.M.

COMMITTEE MEETING MAY 2nd 1987 (Not April 25th as originally arranged)

Mr. W. Turner took the chair.

1. The Meeting started a little late due to the Secretary having been delayed on the journey. The February 28th minutes were read.

2. Matters Arising.

Mr. Eric Gobell had been approached unofficially regarding taking over the post of Treasurer in mid-term, and he had not refused but felt he would like to be approached formally before committing himself. The Secretary agreed to do this.

The location of the next A.G.M. was discussed, Mr. W. Turner said he felt we could use the hall and kitchen of Bethnal Green Centre at a very reasonable price. Mrs. M. Wright had made enquiries and out of numerous possibilities felt that the John Marshall Hall, Blackfairs Road was worth looking into further, it having better accessibility than many others.

3 & 4. Correspondence, New Members, & Treasurers Report

Mrs. K. Card was unable to be present, but had passed on relevant information to Secretary. Since Feb 28th there had been 17 new applications for membership, all were accepted. Club membership on Feb 28th stood at 631, there had been 4 resignations, and 35 had not as yet renewed.

Any other business

It was agreed to deal with this before Revision of Rules, to leave maximim time for latter.

Mrs. R. Ford said she had obtained an electric typewriter that cut stencils better than typewriter used to date. The cost was £30, but it needed servicing which could cost approximately £25. Mrs. Ford asked for the Committee's agreement to this expense, which was given.

Mr. W. Newman said he needed paper and other supplies for Signpost, and asked for Committee's permission to go ahead with replenishing stock, this was given.


Mrs. M. Wright said she had received a letter from Doris Bazeley regretting that due to illness she was unable to attend Committee

5. Revision of Rules.

Typed Suggestions were accepted in the main with only minor alterations. Mr. J. Stevens proposed an addition regarding having proxy votes at A.G.M., sometime was spent discussing mechanics of this, a proposal was put to the vote that Loose Voting Forms should be contained in December Signpost to allow a Postal Vote (no proxy) on Motions as they appear in Signpost. The Voting Forms should be sent to Secretary and administered by Secretary at A.G.M.

The date of the next Committee Meeting was set for July 25th 1987.

RULES LIST

NAME

1. The Club shall be known as 'THE FORTY-PLUS CYCLING CLUB', and membership shall be open to cyclists over forty years of age.

OBJECTS

2. The Objects of the Club shall be to promote fixtures of a social character in areas where there may be sufficient support, and to provide for the interests of members in such other ways as may be decided upon.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

3. (A) An A.G.M. shall be held in London as soon as practicable after 31st December to receive Reports of General Secretary and Treasurer and any other Officer the Committee deems appropriate to deal with relevant ^{club} business.
- (B) A reminder notice be put in the penultimate Signpost produced before an A.G.M. That all Motions must be in the General Secretary's hands four days before the closing date of the last publication of Signpost prior to the A.G.M. Every Motion must be in the Agenda (which will normally be an enclosure in the last issue of Signpost prior to A.G.M.) If for any reason Signpost is not published Motions must be in General Secretary's hands forty-two days prior to A.G.M.
- (C) Every member should have a minimum of fourteen days notice of date, time, and venue of A.G.M.; whenever possible this should be published in Signpost.
- (D) At an A.G.M. thirty members present shall constitute a quorum.

- (E) Members who are unable to attend an A.G.M. may have proxy votes for that A.G.M. but only on Motions exactly as published in Signpost. A Proxy Form will be made available (whenever possible as a loose enclosure in Signpost prior to A.G.M.) Completed Proxy Forms to be in the hands of the General Secretary at least seven days before A.G.M.
- (F) The date of current Rules to be given on Agenda. (see 4 E)

MANAGEMENT

4. (A) At the A.G.M., the following Officers shall be elected to serve for one year:- President (who may be re-elected twice only, making a maximum serving period of three years), Chairperson, General Secretary, Treasurer, Membership Secretary, Editor, and Signpost Printer, all are automatically members of Committee (ex officio), as are all Section Secretaries. A maximum of five additional members may be elected onto the Committee. Section Secretaries may nominate a proxy to attend any Committee Meeting (with full voting rights), if she or he is unable to attend.

A Committee member holding more than one Office, or an 'Additional Committee Member' taking Office in mid-year will be entitled to only one vote (One vote per person),

Members may be present at Committee Meetings, but only with the agreement of the Committee. Visitors will only be observers unless invited to speak, and will have no vote.

- (B) The Committee shall meet in London on some convenient Saturday a minimum of five times a year, and when practicable the date of Meetings to be published in issue of Signpost prior to Meeting. The Committee, when possible, should have fourteen days notice of a forthcoming Meeting. The first Meetings of the above to be held approximately a fortnight before the closing date of copy for Signpost whenever possible. The last Meeting of above should be held at a convenient time to enable discussion of matters relevant to the forthcoming A.G.M.

Committee

At Committee Meetings five members shall constitute a Quorum.

- (C) Auditor, Address Typist, Runs List Typist and Signpost Distributor shall also be elected for one year but are not automatically members of Committee.
- (D) By arrangement with the Committee additional separately operating Sections may be formed, with their own elected Secretary, to manage the Section's affairs. (Subject to Club Rules and with the Committee's agreement.)
- (E) Whenever there are alterations to Club Rules a dated 'Rules and Conditions of Membership of the Forty-Plus Club' be produced, as soon as possible, on a separate sheet or sheets and to be enclosed in Signpost, if there is insufficient time for enclosure with first issue following alteration, then the following one. List should be vetted by Committee before printing commences. The date of the current Rules List should appear on the A.G.M. Agenda.

SUBSCRIPTIONS

- 5.
- (A) The Annual Subscription of £2. 00 (£2. 50 married couple) shall be payable by each member on 1st January each year, and that this payment will cover membership until 31st December of that year.
 - (B) A member who does not renew the subscription by 31st March, may be deemed by the Committee to have resigned.
 - (C) A new member, on joining the Club after 30th June shall pay half the current subscription to cover the remainder of that year.
 - (D) Any member (or married couple) who has (have) completed a Full year's Membership may commute five years Subscriptions by payment of a sum equal to four times the amount of the then annual subscription. Application to commute subscriptions should be made in writing to Membership Secretary before the next renewal date (1st January), the sum required must accompany the application.

COMMITTEE MEETING JULY 25th 1987. (30 Arlington Road, Southgate, N.14)

Mr. W. Turner took the chair.

1. The May 2nd minutes were read and accepted.
Matters Arising
2. The general Secretary reported that she had officially approached Mr. Eric Gobell with a view to taking over Treasurer post, at a convenient time to himself and Mrs. Card (present Treasurer). Mr. Stevens had enquired of several Insurance Brokers re cover for Club Property, but found none were interested because of varied locations of property. It was however intimated that if the various holders had Household Policies these would cover same. Mr. W. Newman had spoken to his Agent telling him that 'he owned a duplicator etc. that were used for his pleasure, and was assured his Household Insurance would cover, providing same was not used for profit.
3. 4. Correspondence, New Members, and Treasurers Report.
Since May 2nd there had been twelve new applications for Membership, all were accepted. Club Membership stands at 651. Sadly there had been three deaths, S. Harvey, W. Jennings and T. Woolf. Mrs. K. Card also reported that in the Club's Building Society Accounts a total sum of £1520 was held.
5. Sometime was spent discussing suggested amended Rules (to be published in next Signpost for consideration of Membership). There were some alterations and additions made to Rules produced for previous Committee Meeting.
6. Any Other Business

Mrs. K. Card proposed that we re-institute advertising in Cycle Touring, after much discussion, including cost effectiveness of same it was decided not to. Mrs. M. Wright suggested producing a Poster to be given to Secretaries etc. who felt the need to advertise in their areas, Mr. J. Stevens suggested that this could be duplicated.
