MINUTES OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD AT THE CHRISTCHURCH INDUSTRIAL CENTRE, BLACKFRIARS RD., LONDON S.E. ON 30TH JANUARY 1988

There were 42 members present and Mr. W. Turner was elected to the Chair unan.

Mr. Turner expressed his thanks to all those attending and extended a very special welcome to a member from Northern Ireland, Mr. C. Henry,

<u>Apologies for Absence</u> had been received from the following:- Mr. A.H. Bridson; Mr. & Mrs. J. Jefford; Gillian Collins; Mr. & Mrs. E. Groom and Mr. & Mrs. C.S. Comport.

<u>Previous Minutes</u> Proposed Mr. D.W. Brunwin; Seconded Anna Ashton; that these be taken as read. <u>Carried</u>

Matters Arising None.

<u>General Secretary's Report</u> Mrs. Maisie Wright had little to add to her report which had already been published in "Signpost" but added that the Club continued to the second with membership flotticking. <u>Report accepted</u>

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> The Chairman introduced Mr. Eric Gobell who had taken over this area of Mrs. Kathy Card's duties. Mr. Gobell pointed out that although at first glance it appeared that the C&ub's financial position was somewhat less favourable than a year earlier, closer examination would show that when stocks were taken into account the position overall was very similar and in fact the difference amounted to around £50 on the right side.

The full Statement of Accounts had already been circulated with "Signpost" and the following points came up for discussion :-

- (a) The auditor had pointed out an error in the circulated statement, i.e. the total of Club Assets given as £2337.02 should read £2327.02.
- (b) Mrs. E. Paine queried the rather large amount of money lying dormant through the amount of unsold badges and transfers in stock.
- (c) Mrs. E. Paine also queried the value of the Club's equipment given under the heading "Assets of Nominal Value", instancing the Editor's typewriter with a nominal value of £1.00 which did not appear to tie up with "Repairs to Typewriter" under "Expenditure" of £74.57.

As to Query (b) Mrs. Card explained that it was more economic to order in large quantities and with membership growing at its present rate the stock would gradually diminish. Mr. D.W. Brunwin, who is au fait with most facets of the medal and badge market also made this point, explaining that with prices constantly increasing it was something of a "roundabouts and swings" situation whereby whatever cash was lost through non-investment of the cash value involved, this would eventually be nullified by the Club not having to purchase the same goods in the future at much higher prices. He added the point that in line with future price increases the Club would be quite justified at charging a little more for the items in question at time of sale.

Mrs. Doris Bazely saw nothing wrong in carrying fairly large stocks of badges provided a record was kept of the location of these items in the various sections. Mrs. Kathy Card assured the meeting that her system of recording the issue of badges appeared to work quite satisfactorily. Although she relied to a large extent on the honesty of the various =Section Secretaries she had not come up against any difficulties in this connection. "A few transfers were not sold but used as the Club's identifying mark when issuing tankards or other gifts or on floral tributes.

As to Query (c) Mrs. M. Wright explained that the value of the Club's assets had been discussed at the previews Committee meeting when it had been concluded that a revaluation was desirable. In this connection Mr. W. Newman explained how through the kindness of friends he had acquired two duplicators, the last one being a much improved machine which the donor wished to have considered as a donation. Replacement value of the equipment in his possession would be of the order of £400 and in the case of the Editor's typewriter more realistic value would be in the region of £150. Mr. J. Stevens pointed out that it was essential to put accurate replacement values on the Club's equipment in case at any future date an insurance factor arose.

These explanations in reply to Queries (b) and (c) were accepted and subject to the necessary amendments outlined the report was accepted.

Membership Secretary's Report - Mrs. Card reported that at 31.12.87 the Clubs paid up membership stood at 677. However, 100 renewals were outstanding. The end 1987 figure compated with 641 at the seme

same date a year earlier, thereby showing a net gain of 36 members. During the year 12 members unfortunately passed away, 26 failed to renew their membership and only 4 actually tendered their resignations. In the -30 days of January the Club gained 14 new members and the 40 Plus was now represented in Northern Ireland, New Zealand, Canada and Australia, though Scotland appeared to be a somewhat barren area so far as membership of the Club was concerned.

The Club now had some 40-50 members who had attained the age of 80. In the nonegenarian category Mr. Bert Harris had already reached his 90th birthday whilst others nearing theirs were Mr. R. Bertouche, Mr. Sid Young and Mr. Harold Gilzean.

Mrs. Card said she had heard some suggestions that the Club should be renamed the 60-Plus because of the large number of members in the older age categories. She pointed out, however, that the Club appeared to be attracting younger people and felt that eventually the different age groups would become more evenly balanced.

Mrs. Doris Bazely enquired whether there was a need to impose geographical limits on the spread of the Club, feeling that an unrestricted spread would lead to an unacceptably high level of administrative work, with which the present band of voluntary management would not be able to cope, both in terms of personal effort and financial considerations. She mentioned that her own section frequently totalled 25 members which sometimes was difficult to control satisfactorily. On this point Mr. J. Scrutton recommended that any section of such size could follow the lead of the Eastern & Northern Thursday runs and split into Groups 'A' and 'B' which used different venues on the same day and members were able to decide for themselves which party they wished to join. Mrs. Doris Bazely asked for the Club's views on the formation of new sections and whether, again, these would create an unacceptable amount of additional administrative work. She mentioned the possibility of sections being formed in the Cambridge and Northampton areas, around Shrewsbury or in the Bucks area by perhaps Jim and Queenie Shaw. Would the Club consider this a favourable expansion or otherwise?

Mr. J. Stevens felt that the strength of any Club rested in the membership and was therefore in favour of the bigger the better. Mrs. M. Wright also felt that the question of the Club's possible expansion was a hypothetical one and no one could really tell how trends would develop in the future, either in terms of new sections or in personal individual memberships. She felt that bridges should not be crossed before one reached them. It was a "wait and see" situation and development of the Club should continue to be encouraged. If at a future date difficulties did arise then appropriate action could be taken at that time. Mr. R. Drew was also reassured on the financial side should overseas members increase in number (bearing in mind the high cost of overseas postage) when it was explained that surface mail was used and some donations were received to assist in defraying costs.

The Chairman commented that the Membership Secretary's outline of the Club showed that many people were still enjoying being part of the 40-Plus both from the pleasure of 'pure' cycling point of view and from the fellowship involved.

Report Accepted

#### Rules

Mr. D.W. Brunwin proposed, seconded by Mr. W. Thorncroft, that the Revised Rules which had been circulated with "Signpost" be accepted subject to any amendments which subsequently arose from the floor. These amendments were :-

(b) Mrs. E. Paine Rule 4(A) Delete "Minutes Secretary" from first paragraph, fifth line.

(c) Mr. W. Thorncroft Rule 4(a) First paragraph. Replace word "Chairperson" (line 3) with word "Chairman".

There was a brief discussion on the views of the three persons bringing forward the amendments which were accepted by those present and the Revised Rules were accepted subject to these amendments being incorporated in them.

Mrs. Doris Bazely raised the point as to the venue in 'London' for committee meetings as defined in the Rules and asked if members were happy with the present venue. It transpired that there was a divergence of opinion as to whether it was the most suitable that could be found. Mr. W. Turner explained that it was very difficult to find somewhere which suited everybody and where we would be warm and welcome and not too high a cost. If anyone could make any other proposals the Club would be quite happy to consider them. Mrs. M. Wright felt that committee meetings in different members' homes was more friendly but realised that this could present difficulties when committee members were domiciled in geographically diverse locations.

## Election of Officers:

<u>President</u> Mrs. M. Wright reported that she had been in touch with four very worthy members of the Club to whom it had been suggested that they might consider being nominated. for President. Unfortunately, and for various reasons, all had declined to stand. It therefore became necessary to invite nominations from the floor. Among those mentioned were Mr. W. Turner, Mr. W. Newman and Mrs. R. Ford, none of whom felt the time was right for them to accept such an honour. The following nominations were therefore put to the vote:-

> Mr. D.W. Brunwin proposed a vote of thanks to the retiring Gen. Sec., Mrs. M. Wright, and thought the Club might wish to consider making some tangible gesture to Mrs. Wright for her past services to the Club. Mr. Turner said he would bring this matter up at the next committee meeting.

Mr. W. Turner thanked Mr. Brunwin once again for the sterling work he puts in to organise the "Ride of the Century", an event enjoyed by not only those actually taking part in the ride but supporters and others connected with the ride. The major part of the organisation was done by Mr. Brunwin single-handed and the Club was very grateful for his services both in terms of time and expense.

Mrs. W. Paine thought special thanks were due to the Runs Leaders who often felt duty bound to brave the elements when weaker mortals had the option of staying at home in the warm.

Mr. W. Moore mentioned that he had just received news that the Club's only 90-year old, Mr. Bert Harris, had been admitted to hospital. No one else appeared to have any information on this but Mrs. M. Wright promised to make enquiries.

Mrs. Bazely said that some difficulties had arisen due to unauthorised persons giving notice of impending runs to catering venues. She thought it should be stressed to all members that advance notice of runs should be the sole responsibility of the Runs, beader Mrs. D. Bazely thought that the consumption of one's own food in public houses should be done in a discreet manner and that all extraneous litter connected with one's own food should be taken away by the member concerned.

Mrs. Card reported that difficulties which had arisen with a "Happy Eater" catering establishment, when a group of cyclists were refused service, had been resolved after contact had been made with top management of the "Happy Eater" chain. They had intimated that the incident had arisen through the action of an individual manager and was not a management directive at all. It was hoped that no future difficulties would be encountered.

The Chairman appealed to Membership in general to observe an acceptable code of conduct as regards litter, etc., when on runs, which he was sure the vast majority of members always did.

The meeting closed at 1.10 p.m.

SUMMARY OF MINUTES OF A.G.M. HELD ON 30TH JANUARY 1988 (Full text available if required on application to Hon. Gen. Sec.)

Hon. Gen. Sec.'s heport: Most facts already published in "Signpost". Club continued to run satisfactorily with membership flourishing.

Treasurer's Report: Chmn. introduced Mr. E. Gobell who had taken over this area of Mrs. Card's duties. Mr. Gobell pointed out that although at first glance it appeared that the Club's financial position was somewhat less favourable than a year earlier, closer examination showed that when stocks were taken into account the position overall was very similar; in fact the difference compared with the previous year amounted to around £50 on the right side. \*\*\*\*\*\*

Queries from the floor on above report were: (i) the rather large amount of money lying dormant due to the seemingly excessive level of insold badges and transfers in stock. This situation was satisfactorily explained and it was felt that high stocks of badges, etc. were not detrimental provided accurate records were kept of their value and location. Mrs. Card assured the meeting that this was already the case....(ii) the value of Club Equipment given under the heading "Assets of Nominal Value" (including the Editor's typewriter with nominal value of £1.00, which did not seem to tie up Mrs. Wright explained that the value of the Club's assets had been discussed at the previous committee meeting when it had been decided that a revaluation was desirable. Mr. Newman gave a run-down of the circumstances which had led to his acquiring improved duplicating for the items in question would be £400 for equipment in his possession and £150 in the case of the Editor's typewriter. Mr. J. Stevens felt it essential to put accurate replacement values factor arose.

Did the Club welcome the formation of new sections? She mentioned in this connection the possibility of new sections being formed in the Cambridge and Northampton areas, around Shrewsbury or in the Bucks area.

After some discussion it was felt that in general new members and sections should be encouraged. Mr. J. Scrutton commented that should any one section become too unwieldy, it could be split on the same lines as the Eastern and Northern 'A' and 'B' groups. Mr. J. Stevens also supported this view, as did Mrs. M. Wright who felt that the situation could be reviewed should administrative difficulties get out of hand.

All members should adhere to this arrangement and should observe an acceptable code of behaviour in relation to litter, etc., when on runs, which the Chairman felt that most members already tried to do.

#### FORTY PLUS C. C. COMMITTEE MEETING JANUARY 16th 1988

Mr. W. Turner took the chair.

1. The October 24th minutes were taken as read.

2. No matters arising directly from previous meeting except as regards to matters relating to A.G.M.

3. Correspondence and new members. Since October 24th there had been twenty-three applications for Membership (including one member renewing after a five year lapse), all were accepted. One lady had resigned having moved out of our area.

4. Treasurer's Report. Our new Treasurer Mr. Eric Gobell reported that Len Hathaway who died recently had left £25 to the Forty Plus.

5. Matters Relating to A.G.M. Mrs. R. Ford stated she was concerned about the Statement of Accounts in relation to Electric Typewriter that she had obtained on the Club's behalf during the past vear. The Typewriter which was secondhand needed some repairs, both the cost of buying and the repairs were lumped together under Repairs., and there was no record in the Assets of the aquisition. It then transpired that a similiar situation existed as regards the donated It was considered that the typewriter should Electric Duplicator. be valued at £150 and the Duplicator at £400. For accountancy purposes it was agreed £475. 43p should be added to Donations (£400 for Duplicator and £75. 43 for Typewriter.).

Mr. J. Stevens brought the Committee's attention to errors in the 'Suggested Rules', a typing omission of the word'time' on the 4th line of Rule 4 (E) between the words insufficient and for. A more serious omission relating to Management was 'the method of adoption of Section Secretaries.' The following words were suggested as an amendment to Rules 'Each Section shall name their own Secretary, for ratification at A.G.M., or Committee Meeting', and be inserted at the end of the first paragraph in 4 (A).

The question of a new President was then discussed, several names were suggested, Mr. Ben Crook, Mr. Jack Jefford, possibly joint with Prim, Vic Stewart and Mr. Bill Turner. The General Secretary was asked to approach them to see if any of them were prepared to accept the honour, but making it clear he/they were not the only possible candidates, Mr. W. Turner being present at the meeting accepted nomination in the realization that there could be a ballot.

Any Other Business.

Mr. W. Moore said Tuesday June 21st, seemed the best date for the Re-Union, he thought to hold it at Haultwick again, there were no objections.

### COMMITTEE MEETING JANUARY 16th 1988 Continued.

Mr. J. Scrutton wondered if we could have receipts with a Forty Plus Badge on, The Gegenal Secretary said she would look into the boxes of odds and ends she holds to see if there was a block or stamp that might fit the bill.

Mrs. A. Ashton, brought to the Committee's notice a problem she has encountered, namely that Mr. W. Paget had been telling landlords of Pubs that we would be coming on such and such a date. This had caused some confusion, Mrs. A. Ashton had asked Mr. W. Paget to refrain from doing so but to no avail. It was agreed that the General Secretary should write to Mr. W. Paget on the Committee's behalf. In the course of dicussion it also emerged that the Eastern Section had had a somewhat similiar problem from an unknown source, it was agreed that the General Secretary should ask members to leave the booking to the Section Secretaries, in the next Secretarial Notes.

Mr. H. Rumball brought to the Committee's attention a newspaper article relating to the Happy Eater on the A10 (near Barwick Ford) in

Aich it was reported that the eating house had been fined £9,000 for unhygenic conditions. Mrs. K. Card said that further to her report in Signpost on the same cafe, she had heard of a C.T.C. member who wrote to Happy Eaters Head Office/Director regarding their refusal to allow cyclists to enter their establishment, and had a reply to the effect that their Manager had no licence to take this action, and in future cyclists would be welcomed.

Mr. R. Freeman, who had joined us in the Committee Room a little earlier, at the suggestion of Mrs. M. Wright, in order to bring to our attention a Charity being organised by the Church of England. Mr. R. Freeman, who is a regular church goer, explained that the Church are organising a Fund Raising Enterprize to help the Underprivilaged in Peprived Areas, and he wondered if As Cyclists (many of whom had spent their childhood and youth in such areas) we might be prepared to help raise funds by some Cycle or Cycle Related means. He said he had already got some offers of help with the organising, and it had been suggested that an Event or Events would not take place until about May next year (1989) for technical reasons. Mr. R. Freeman said that: therefore there was no pressure for an immediate answer and members of the Committee would have time to sound out other cyclists.

The date of the next Committee Meeting will be arranged immediately after the end of the A.G.M. by the new Committee.

# 2. Minutes of Committee Meeting - 18th June 1988

- having been circulated, the minutes were taken as read and approved.

Arising therefrom the Chairman referred again to the letter of resignation from Mr. & Mrs. Rudkins but Mrs. Card pointed out that their commuted membership still had two years to run.

# 3. General Secretary's Report

Mr. Rowland said he had little to add to his report in "Signpost". A very pleasant letter of acknowledgment had been received from Mrs R. Emburey following the presentation of an 80th birthday tankard to her husband, Laurence.

The visit of a Club party of 25 members to Boulogne to ride in the "Pas de Calais" randonnée on 17th/18th September had been most enjoyable, under the able management of Mr. D. Brunwin. The 40-Plus had been presented with a vase in recognition of their numbers. It was agreed that this should be held on the Club's behalf by Mr. Brunwin.

# 4. Treasurer's Report

Mr. E. Gobell reported that the funds of the Club at 30th September 1988 totalled £1,768.28 and reminded members that he required statements of expenses and of stocks held at the end of the financial year. On the question of the value of equipment to be shown in the annual accounts it was agreed that each item would be entered at a nominal value of £1.00.

# 5. Membership Secretary's Report

Mrs. K. Card reported the enrolment of 20 new members to the Club since June. Mrs. D. Bazely had advised of the recent death of Mr. Jack Mott of Stevenage. The Club had been represented at the funeral.

# 6. "Signpost" Team Report

Mr. J. Stevens reported a change of mailing bags and referred to the delay in dispatch of the September issue due to the postal strike. Postal charges had increased and the cost of mailing (including the bags) had now increased from 22p to 27p per member for an issue of 100 grammes in weight, or £1.08 per member per year.

#### 6. (Continued)

Mrs. R. Ford explained that to keep within the 100 grammes per copy it was necessary to limit "Signpost" to 32 pages which occasionally meant holding over contributions. After some discussion it was agreed that the 32 page limit on content should normally be retained, though a decision on whether to issue an enlarged issue from time to time could be left to the discretion of the editor, for example, the December issue would probably have to be larger, due to the inclusion of extra end-of-year items.

It was further agreed that to meet rising costs a recommendation should be made to the next A.G.M. that members' annual subscriptions be raised to £2.50 for individuals and to £3.00 for married couples, with commuted membership fees adjusted pro rata.

Mr. W. Newman requested approval to £200 being expended on a further six months' supply of duplicating paper, which was agreed.

Mr. D. Brunwin said that he was extending the closing date for entries for the "Signpost" prize crossword to 18th October.

# 7. Section Secretaries' Reports

Mrs. A. Ashton (East Herts) said that she wished to give up her duties as runs leader at the end of the year.

It was also reported that Mr. B. Moss wished to give up leadership of the Eastern 'B' and Sunday sections.

Mr. J. Scrutton said that the Eastern "A" Section "car and bike" runs had been well supported and that the six members who had visited the Southern Section had enjoyed their day.

#### 8. Club Rules

Mr. Rowland referred to the draft he had previously circulated in which he had attempted to place certain of the rules agreed at the last A.G.M. in a more logical order without altering the wording of any rule. #### 3. General Secretary's Report

Mr. Rowland referred to his report in "Signpost" and added that Mr. John Allen had expressed his thanks for the tankard received on his 80th birthday on 9th November. In the event of an accident, as the Club was not affiliated to the RTTC (or BCF), the Club or its members could be exposed to a claim for damages without the benefit of insurance cover. He felt strongly that members should be warned and that no reference to the 40 Plus C.C. should be made on event start sheets, etc. If individual members who wished to help in events were not otherwise covered, they should be advised to take out some form of 3rd party insurance.

Mr. Rowland said he would seek confirmation of the legal position and, depending on the result, a suitable warning notice would be published in "Signpost".
