RULES OF THE FORTY-PLUS CYCLING CLUB

1. NAME

The Club shall be known as 'THE FORTY-PLUS CYCLING CLUB' and membership shall be open to cyclists over forty years of age.

2. OBJECTS

To promote fixtures of a social character in areas where there may be sufficient support and to provide for the interests of members in such other ways as may be decided upon.

3. MANAGEMENT

The affairs of the Club shall be managed by a committee appointed each year at the Annual General Meeting.

4. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

- (a) The A.G.M. shall be held in London as soon as possible after 31st December to receive reports from officers of the Committee and to consider motions put forward by the Committee or members. Motions for consideration must be presented to the General Secretary at least 42 days before the published date of the meeting.
- (b) Every member shall receive a copy of the Notice and Agenda for the A.G.M. at least 14 days before the date of the meeting.
- (c) Thirty members present shall constitute a quorum.
- (d) Members unable to attend the A.G.M. may vote by proxy on any motion published in the Agenda. Proxy forms will be supplied, returnable to the General Secretary at least seven days before the meeting. (The chair will act as proxy).

5. CONSTITUTION AND POWERS OF COMMITTEE

- (a) At the A.G.M. the following Officers shall be elected to serve for one year: - President (who may be re-elected twice only, making a maximum serving period of three years); Chairman; General Secretary; Treasurer; Membership Secretary; "Signpost" Editor; Address Typist: List Typist; "Signpost" Printer: "Signpost" Distributor: all of whom are automatically members of the Committee as are all Section Secretaries. A maximum of five additional mambers may be elected on to the Committee. Section Secretaries may nominate a proxy to attend any committee meeting (with full voting rights) if he or she is unable to attend. Each section shall name its own Secretary for ratification at the A.G.M. or committee meeting. Auditor shall also be elected for one year but not be a member of the committee.
- (b) In the event of an Office becoming vacant in mid-term the Committee may appoint an Acting Officer to serve until the next A.G.M. A committee member holding more than one office will be entitled to only one vote (one vote per person). Members may be present at committee meetings, but only with the agreement of a member of the Committee, who will notify the General Secretary. Visitors will only be observers unless invited to speak and will have no vote.

5. (Continued)

- (c) The Committee shall meet quarterly and shall receive 14 days' notice of a forthcoming meeting.
- (d) At a Committee Meeting five members shall constitute a quorum.
- (c) With the agreement of the Committee separately operating sections may be formed with their own elected Secretary.

6. SUBSCRIPTIONS

- (a) The appropriate annual subscription shall be payable by each member on 1st January each year and this payment will cover membership until 31st December of that year. A member who does not renew his subscription by 31st January may be deemed by the Committee to have resigned.
- (b) Members reaching the age of 85 will be granted honorary membership and no further subscriptions will be payable.
- (c) A new member joining the Club after 30th September shall pay the current subscription for one year to cover the remainder of that year and the whole of the following year up to 31st December.
- (d) Any member who has completed a full year's membership may commute five years' subscriptions by payment of a sum equal to four times the amount of the annual subscription. A married couple's subscription may be commuted as above provided one of the couple has completed one year's membership. Application to commute subscriptions should be made in writing to the Membership Secretary.

7. FUNDS AND ACCOUNTS

- (a) The subscriptions shall be received by the Membership Secretary and the Club Funds be held by the Treasurer, to be administered by that Officer under the direction of the Committee.
- (b) Expenditure in excess of £100 shall be subject to prior approval by the Committee.
- (c) Withdrawals from Building Society Accounts, or from any similar account, shall require four Trustees: General Secretary, Treasurer and two other Committee members, two of whose signatures shall be necessary for withdrawals from said account(s).
- (d) Riders with Sections may pay their subscriptions either directly to the Membership Secretary or to their Section Secretaries.
- (e) The Treasurer shall prepare the Club Accounts as at 30th September each year, which shall be audited and published with the Agenda for the A.G.M.

8. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

(a) Members may be accompanied on Club Fixtures by members of their own family under forty years of age.

8. (Continued)

- (b) The Committee have the power to suspend any member for action prejudicial to the best interests of the Club, the member's expulsion, or otherwise, to be decided upon within one month of the suspension taking effect.
- (c) Tankards, book tokens (or equivalent) shall be presented to members on completion of fifteen years of continuous membership, provided they have also passed their eightieth birthday.

9. CLUB RULES - ALTERATIONS AND ADDITIONS

- (a) Alterations and/or additions to Club Rules may only be made at an Annual General Meeting or at a Special General Meeting.
- (b) Special General Meetings shall be called by the Secretary on receipt of a request signed by at least 24 members. Members shall have 14 days' notice of a Special General Meeting and be informed of the purpose of the meeting.
- ((c) Whenever there are alterations to Club Rules a revised set of rules shall be produced and issued to all members.)
 - (d) Any case not provided for in the Rules shall be decided upon by the Committee.

10. CLUB MAGAZINE

The Club shall publish a quarterly magazine, entitled "Signpost", to be posted to each member free of charge. In the interests of economy the Committee and Officers of the Club shall use the magazine as the principal means of communication with members on all appropriate Club business.

General Secretary's Report: Reports had appeared quarterly in "Signpost". The new site for the A.G.M. (Chalice Foundation) found at cost of £25. Haultwick re-union and Club '100' again held. Club jerseys and jackets introduced via Mr. D.W. Brunwin. Mrs. R. Ford had presented a plaque to be awarded annually for most interesting article in "Signpost" (in commemoration of her 80th birthday). Mr. J. Stevens was to set up a Map Lending Library.

Treasurer's Report: Balance of £1896.10 carried forward after operating surplus of £249.85. Price increases on stocks of badges and transfers announced. Report and audited accounts accepted.

Membership Secretary's Report: Club strength at 31.12.89. was 751. 76 new members had joined, 4 resigned, 31 not renewed and, sadly, at least 18 had died. 80-100 subscriptions were still outstanding. Report accepted.

Club Rules: Revised draft rules for 1990 had been circulated, changed as little as possible from 1988 edition. Changes were:- (a) Rule 3 - Management of Club by the Committee (not previously specified)....(b) Rule 10 - formal recognition of "Signpost" as club magazine and communications medium...... DRAFT RULES OF THE FORTY-PLUS CYCLING CLUB (1990)

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MINUTES OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD ON 27TH JANUARY 1990 AT THE CHALICE FOUNDATION 117 MANSFORD STREET, LONDON E.2.



1. ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN

The General Secretary opened the meeting by welcoming the 47 members present and explaining that, since publication of the Agenda, Mr. W.J. Turner had said he did not wish to stand for re-election as Chairman of the Club for a further year. It would therefore be appropriate for Mr. Turner to chair the meeting as his final act in office. Members present were pleased to accept this suggestion

After apologies for absence were reported from Mrs. D. Bazely, Mr. E. Mascall and Mr. C. Henry, Mr. Turner took the Chair.

2. MINUTES

The (abridged) Minutes of the A.G.M. held on 28th January 1989, circulated with the Agenda, were taken as read and approved.

3. MATTERS ARISING

The Membership Secretary, Mrs. K. Card, raised the possibility of changing the subscription year from 1st January to 1st April annually to coincide with the Club's financial year. This could be achieved by granting 15 months' membership in the change-over year. A.G.M's could continue to be held in January and any agreed change in Club subscriptions, etc. could come into effect from 1st April of the same year.

The suggestion was noted for consideration by the Committee.

4. GENERAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

Mr. Rowland said that the Club had enjoyed another successful year and most sections were understood to be flourishing. The Committee had met four times and a summary of their activities had appeared quarterly in "Signpost". Points of particular interest were:-

- (a) The new site for the A.G.M. (Chalice Foundation) had been found at the reduced hiring charge of £25, thanks to a suggestion by Mrs. K. Coldwell.
- (b) The Haultwick re-union had been held on 20th June in fine weather and was much enjoyed.
- (c) A range of "40-Plus" jerseys and jackets had been introduced and were selling well. The Club were greatly indebted to Mr. D.W. Brunwin for the hard work he had put into this project.
- (d) The Club '100' held on 13th July had been a great success but unfortunately the organiser (Doug Brunwin) had been unable to take part due to his temporary ill-health. Mr. W. Thorncroft and other helpers had deputized for him.
- (e) Mrs. Rose Ford had most kindly presented the Club with a handsome plaque to be awarded annually to the author of the most interesting article in "Signpost", selected by vote of members. The plaque was recognised as commemorating Mrs. Ford's 80th birthday and 37 years' membership of the Club.
- (f) At the December 1989 meeting of the Committee Mr. J. Stevens had put forward a proposal that a map library should be set up from which members could borrow maps for holiday purposes etc. on payment of a nominal fee. Members would be asked to donate unwanted maps to provide the initial pool. The Committee would be giving further

consideration to this idea and details would be published in a future issue of "Signpost".

The Secretary's Report was accepted unanimously.

5. TREASURER'S REPORT

Mr. E. Gobell referred to the audited Statement of Accounts for the year ended 30th September 1989, issued with the Agenda. Club funds now totalled £1896.10, after an operating surplus for the year amounting to £249.85.

The Treasurer further reported on the Committee's decision to charge nominally higher prices on badges and transfers held in stock, as a hedge against the inflated prices expected to be payable when stocks were due to be replenished.

The Report was accepted unanimously.

6. MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY'S REPORT

Mrs. K. Card gave detailed statistics of the distribution of members throughout the world and of the changes in the past year. Membership at 31/12/89 stood at 751, a net increase of 23 over the previous year. 76 new members had joined during the year, 4 had resigned, 31 had not renewed and, sadly, at least 18 had died, including 3 in road accidents. The over-80's now numbered 60 and two were in their 90's.

Some 80-100 subscriptions for 1990 were still outstanding. 80 members had commuted subscriptions over 5 years.

Mrs. Card added that when she became Membership Secretary in April 1985 the Club strength was 550, i.e. there had been a net increase of some 200 members in five years.

The Report was accepted unanimously.

7. CLUB RULES

At the Chairman's request the General Secretary explained the changes proposed in the Club Rules for 1990 onwards as set out in the draft circulated with the Agenda. Mr. Rowland said that the present rules had been approved in January 1988 and had been changed as little as possible. Apart from the minor amendments approved at the January 1989 A.G.M. the changes were:-

- (a) Rule 3 Management of the Club by the Committee (not previously specified.
- (b) Use of "Signpost" as a means of communication the removal of repeated references in various rules and consolidation into a new Rule 10 "Club Magazine" (incidentally, the first occasion on which the Club's largest item of expenditure would be authorised in the rules!).
- (c) Rule 7(b) £100 limit on expenditure without Committee approval would give exact definition. Previous rule referred to "occasional large expenses".

On the proposal of Mrs. E. Paine; seconded by Mr. D. Brunwin <u>RESOLVED</u> that the rules set out in the draft document "Rules of the Forty-Plus Cycling Club (1990)" be adopted.

MINUTES OF COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON 10TH NOVEMBER, 1990, AT

196, WIDMORE ROAD, BROMLEY, KENT

<u>Present:</u> Mr. D.W. Brunwin (Chairman) and 14 members. A warm welcome was extended to Ms. Carole Green (Stevenage & North Herts) on her first attendance.

Apologies for Absence: Mrs. D. Bazely; Mr. E. Brampton; Mrs. E. Gobell; Mr. G. Hooper; Mr. W. Turner.

1. Minutes of Meeting, 18th August 1990 Proposed by Mrs. E. Paine, seconded by Mr. E. Gobell, that these be accepted as a true record.

2. Matters Arising

- (a) A letter from Mr. E. Engel was received expressing his disappointment at the decision not to accept a plaque for 82-year-old-plus riders in the 40-Plus '100'. The Chairman and General Secretary had spoken separately to Mr. Engel on this matter.
- (b) 40th Anniversary Celebrations The Chairman said that the Victoria C.C. had indicated their willingness to allow the use of their hut mid-week and he was confident that other clubs would follow suit. Members felt that a 3-day (2 nights) event in mid-May would be suitable. Messrs. D.W. Brunwin, H. Rumball, J. Scrutton and E. Gobell were elected to form a sub-committee and an invitation would be extended to Mrs. M. Wright (E. Herts) to join this sub-committee to work out detailed proposals for presentation to the next A.G.M. An interim announcement would be made in the December "Signpost"
 - * N.B. Mrs. Maisie Wright has kindly accepted.
- c) Section Titles The Secretary reported that the only suggestion received to date was from Mr. E. Brampton who had proposed that the Eastern & Northern 'B' Section might be renamed "South West Essex".

In discussion representatives present agreed to the following changes:-

- Eastern & Northern Sections to become "Essex 'A'";
 "Essex 'B'" and "Essex Sunday".
- 2. Southern Section to become "South-East Section".
- no other changes were contemplated.

3. General Secretary's Report

Mr. Rowland reported that "80-Plus" tankards had been delivered to Mr. Bill Moore (see letter in Sept. "Signpost") and Mr. Roy Challenger. A donation had been sent to St. Francis Hospice as requested by Mr. Tom Wooder. He was awaiting

information regarding the wishes of Mr. J. Jefford, the only remaining qualifier in 1990.

The recent death of Mrs. Edna Rayne (formerly Bowers) at the age of 78 had been reported. Edna had been a most successful member of the Rosslyn Ladies C.C. but to date the Secretary had not been able to trace her nearest relative. (Enquiries continuing).

4. Membership Secretary's Report

Mrs. E. Blake said that the Club's strength to date stood at 770 members, 63 new members having joined in 1990, against a loss of 56. A suggestion by Mr. S. Scott (I.O.W.) for a recruitment drive was not accepted.

The Committee agreed that it would be too costly to supply all Club members with full membership lists (as was the previous practice) but brief details of newly joined members would be published in "Signpost".

On the question of the renewal of subscriptions, reminder slips for annual payers and for those whose commuted subscriptions were due would be issued with "Signpost". Mrs. Blake would also set up a "payment table" at the forthcoming Christmas Iuncheon of the Essex sections.

5. Treasurer's Report

Mr. Gobell reported that the Club accounts for 1989/90 had been completed and audited. There had been an operating surplus of £186. A legacy to the Club of £500, made by the late Mr. A.V. Palmer of Stevenage (member of the Viking Road Club) had been received from his executor. Club funds currently totalled £2590.62.

6. "Signpost" Team

Mrs. R. Ford reported that she and Mrs. E. Paine had now completed their re-write of the Club history and were thanked by the Committee for their work. At Mr. Stevens' suggestion it was agreed that copies should be sent to all members with the "40th Anniversary" issue of "Signpost". The Chairman suggested that in the interest of up-dating and rapid production a master copy should be recorded on a computer disc. He undertook to investigate this and advise further.

Mr. J. Stevens referred to the difficulties with the supply of polythene folders which had forced him to purchase self-seal manilla envelopes. He explained the various cost/weight problems in posting the magazine as economically as possible. The Chairman offered to include the Club's needs in the bulk purchase of envelopes for various other purposes (@ 20,000 rate).

Mr. W. Newman was granted permission to spend £200 on further supplies of duplicating paper and magazine covers. It was also agreed that a range of obsolete stencil masters should be scrapped.

7. Section Secretaries' Reports

Mr. J. Scrutton said that 35 had attended a "Steak & Kidney Pie" lunch at White Roding and he was expecting a good attendance at the Essex Sections' Christmas lunch on 6th December (Epping).

Mr. J. Rainbow referred to the successful visit by South-East Section members to Essex on 22nd August which had been most enjoyable.

Ms. Carole Green reported a forthcoming celebration by the Stevenage & N. Herts Section at the "Crown", Shillington, on 15th November.

8. Data Protection Act

Mr. Rowland said that a member (Mr. Jim Shaw) had reminded him that the Club might need to register under the Act now that members' names and addresses were kept on a computer. He had written to the Registrar and received application forms and explanatory booklets. It appeared that exemption could be claimed under the section headed "Unincorporated Members' Clubs (A.6)" provided that all members of the Club were asked whether they objected to their personal data (i.e. names and addresses) being held by the Club. This condition could be met by including a request for objections to be placed prominently in the Club newsletter, i.e. "Signpost". Any member so objecting would have his/her name removed from the computer record. Similarly, a question to this effect should be included on membership allication forms.

A second condition related to the disclosure of such information without prior consent, but it appeared that in no circumstances would membership details be released to other parties.

The Committee agreed that the General and Membership Secretaries should proceed on the lines indicated, a suitable notice to appear in "Signpost".

9. Annual General Meeting - 26th January 1991

Mr. Rowland said he would shortly confirm the booking of the hall with the Chalice Foundation. The agenda and abridged minutes would be issued immediately after 15th December, the closing date for the submission of propositions, which would necessitate holding the despatch of the December "Signpost" until these documents were available.

All the offices in the Club would become vacant in January, to be filled by nomination and election at the A.G.M. (Club Rule 5(d).

With the exception of the office of President (see 10 below)

it was understood that all the current officers would be prepared to serve for a further year, subject to nomination and election. It should be noted, however, that the post of "Signpost" address list typist was now redundant following the adoption of computerised label production.

10. Club President

It was noted that Mr. J.R. Wyatt would complete three years' service as President in January 1991 and a successor would need to be found. Nominations would need to be made at the A.G.M.

In discussion members felt that there were several men and women deserving of this honour and it would be appropriate if in future the presidency were filled strictly on an annual rotation basis. It was therefore - AGREED TO RECOMMEND to the Annual General Meeting that Rule 5(a) be amended to read "President (to serve one year only)".

11. Map Lending Library

Mr. J. Stevens reported that the catalogue was now complete and ready to be published with "Signpost". Members felt that the continuing work of the map librarian should be recognised by an appointment to the Committe and - AGREED TO RECOMMEND to the Annual General Meeting that the post of Club Map Librarian be recognised, the holder to serve on the Club Committee (addition to Club Rule 5(a)).

12. Date and Place of Next Meeting

To be decided by the Committee appointed at the A.G.M. Meanwhile, thanks were due to John and Norah Rainbow for their excellent hospitality.

Present: Mr. D.W. Brunwin (Chairman) and 15 members.

Apologies for Absence: Mrs. E. Gobell; Mr. W.S. Moore; Ms. C. Green

- 1. Minutes of Committee Meeting, 3rd March, 1990 Proposed by Mr. E. Gobell, seconded by Mr. J. Scrutton that these be accepted as a true record, subject to the understanding of Minute No. 8 that the Committee were not in favour of commercial advertising in "Signpost".
 - (a) Map Lending Library Mr. J. Stevens reported that to date he had received 125 U.K. and 54 foreign maps from members. He had produced a statement of rules for publication in the June issue of "Signpost" and expected to be able to produce a catalogue for distribution to all members with the December issue. After then, new members would receive a copy of the catalogue (with rules) on joining. Expenditure to date was £8.59 for purchase of card index, ring binder, etc. Committee approved these arrangements.
 - (b) "Signpost" advertisement reported that Mr. P. Wilding had donated £3 to Club funds.
 - (c) Mr. Fred Platt had received his '80-Plus' tankard and had written letter of appreciation.
 - (d) Information for new members In reply to an enquiry from Mrs. E. Blake as to whether in future she should send the complete package to all new registrations, section secretaries present said they would prefer to leave the matter optional as some preferred to hold and issue information documents locally.
- 2. Stevenage & North Herts Section Reported that Mr. A. Fidoe had resigned as Runs Leader and that Ms. Carol Green (117 Ripon Rd., Stevenage. SG1 4LW) had kindly volunteered to take over. The Committee thanked Art Fidoe for his past services and Ms. Green was approved as his successor.

3. General Secretary's Report

(a) Mr. W.S. Moore - Bill Moore had written to express his concern as to recent Committee meetings being held in Essex rather than in Central London which made it difficult for certain members to attend. MINUTES OF COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON 3RD MARCH, 1990 AT 180 WESTERN ROAD, BILLERICAY

Present: Mr. D.W. Brunwin (chairman) and 13 members

- 1. Apologies for absence: Mr. & Mrs. H. Rumball
- 2. Minutes of Committee Meeting, 9th December 1989: Proposed Mr. W. Turner, seconded Mr. E. Gobell, were accepted as a true record. There was no matter arising.
- 3. Annual General Meeting, 27th January 1990: The General Secretary reported on the business conducted, including the adoption of the proposed club rules and the appointment of officers and section secretaries for 1990.

Arising from the Secretary's Report the following matters were considered:-

(a) Club subscription year - Mrs. K. Card had proposed that the date for renewal of club subscriptions should be changed from 1st January to 1st April annually to enable any increase agreed at a January A.G.M. to be applied without delay, and the Committee had been asked to consider the proposal as an alternative to the previous suggestion that the A.G.M. be brought forward to December.

Following discussion the proposal was not accepted but it was AGREED that in the case of new members joining the club after 30th September the full subscription set at the previous January A.G.M. should be applied and that Club Rule 6 (c) be interpreted accordingly.

Card Secretary reported a letter from Mrs. Card thanking the Committee for the presentation of the plaque in recognition of her services as Membership Secretary, but expressing her disappointment on not being elected to membership of the Committee in 1990 which she felt was connected with the circumstances of her private life.

Committee members sympathised with Mrs. Card's disappointment but were unanimous in their belief that the matters she referred to were not a factor in the result of the vote at the A.G.M. The Secretary was instructed to advise her accordingly.

In a second letter Mrs. Card had indicated that the advance of £60 made to her in September 1988 for operating expenses had been exhausted by the end of her term in office, although she was unable to submit an exact account. The Committee accepted this statement and it was noted that stocks of badges, etc. had been handed over to the new Membership Secretary, Mrs. E. Blake, who should also receive an expenses advancement of £60.

Mrs. Card had also commented on problems of "late payers" in January 1990 and had drafted a revised "Renewal of Membership"

form, copy of which had been handed to Mrs. E. Blake. Finally, Mrs. Card had suggested that Mr. Fred Platt, who had resigned from 1st January 1990 due to ill-health, and who reached the age of 80 in 1988, had virtually completed 15 years of membership and should be allowed to qualify for a presentation. 9. Section Secretaries' Reports


Mr. J. Rainbow referred to the recent death of Southern Section member, Sam Hall, on 8th February 1990. Ten members had attended his funeral.

The comment in the Committee Meeting Minutes regarding the non-attendance of Section Leaders at Committee Meetings, stirred what was already a guilty conscience. I therefore write to apologise for my non-attendance and tender my excuses, namely, that a round trip would be in the order of 200 miles and these days I dislike driving to the extent that I find 200 miles of car driving more tiring than 50 miles on a bike, and definitely less enjoyable.

Looking back I am somewhat aghast at my temerity in starting a section when I had only been in the club for a matter of months, and I wonder what the committee members must have thought of my actions! Mr. Rowland reported that he had delivered an '80-Plus' tankard to Mr. John Wilson (Southend on Sea). Tankards were also due for Mr. Bill Moore (Potters Bar) and shortly for Mr. Tom Wooder (Poplar) and Mr. Roy Challenger (Canvey Island). However, Tom Wooder had replied that he did not require the tankard and requested that a donation of equivalent value (£16) be donated to St. Francis Hospice, Havering-atte-Bower, which was agreed.

Mr. E. Engel had offered to provide a plaque for the first rider over the age of 82 years to complete the 40-Plus '100'. The proposal was discussed but not favoured by the Committee as tending to introduce an inappropriate element of competition among elderly members.

Sadly, the deaths of Mr. Edgar Clarke (Barling Magna) and Mr. Alf Maxwell (Corringham) were reported. The Club would be represented at the latter's funeral.

4. Membership Secretary

Mr. Rowland reported that Mrs. E. Blake was unfortunately unable to attend due to a bereavement, but she had advised him that 15 new members had joined in the last quarter.

5. Treasurer's Report

Mr. E. Gobell reported Club funds standing at £2143.28. He reminded budget holders that the financial year ended on 30th September and he would require accounts to be submitted immediately thereafter.

6. "Signpost" Team

Mr. W. Newman reported by letter that he would be printing the September issue on return from holiday on 27th August. Mr. Stevens said that postal charges would be increased in September. Mrs. R. Ford said that she had bought a copy of Mr. Arthur Cook's book, "The Luck of the Road", for the Club's archives and had written to the Pensioners' Magazine, "Yours", following an article in it on cycling which had not mentioned the 40-Plus.

7. Section Secretaries Reports

Following brief verbal reports a letter from Carole Green was read indicating that the Stevenage & North Herts. members were enjoying their cycling. A letter giving an interesting account of the development of the East Northants section was received from founder Ron Mills. Members offered their congratulations on his success and felt that the letter should appear in "Signpost" as a matter of general interest.

8. Letter from Mrs. M. Wright - 23rd. June 1990.

The General Secretary referred to the letters from his predecessor, Mrs. Maisie Wright, which he had circulated to the Committee and which, at Maisie's request, would be published in full in the September issue of "Signpost". A letter had also been received from Mr. G. Hooper, St. Albans, saying that members of his section who had seen Mrs. Wright's letter agreed with it almost in it's entirety, particularly regarding the location of Committee meetings.

Members expressed their concern at the implications of some parts of the letter but it was finally agreed that the organisational changes proposed should be a matter for decision by the club membership as a whole through the medium of the A.G.M. It would therefore be a matter for those seeking such changes to submit formal proposals for inclusion in the Agenda, the closing date for which could be 15th December, 1990.

9. 40th Anniversary.

Mr. Rowland reminded members that 1991 would be the 40th anniversary of the founding of the 40-Plus and suggested that some form of celebration would be appropriate. In discussion, the holding of a 2-3 day "get-together" in the style of a C.T.C. rally was favoured, the duration making it worthwhile for members to travel over a distance to attend. One suggestion made was that it might be possible to borrow the accommodation available in the complex of club huts of the 32nd. milestone association on the North Essex/Hertfordshire borders, mid-week in September, and the chairman offered to make enquiries.

Other suggestions would be welcomed and, if possible, a recommendation would be agreed at the next meeting, to enable an announcement to be made in the December issue of "Signpost".

10. Section Titles.

Mr. J. Stevens suggested that as the club had expanded over the years since its formation around the London area, the titles of some sections had become geographically rather misleading. For example, the Eastern and Northern sections might be better termed "N.E. London & Essex"; and the Southern section "S.E. London & Kent". It was generally agreed that there was much merit in the idea but it would be primarily a matter for decision by the membership of each section.

The Secretary said he would include an item to this effect in his "Signpost" report inviting members to discuss possibilities with their runs leaders, who could then report back to enable any necessary motion to be put to the A.G.M.

11. Date and Place of Next Meeting.
