MINUTES OF A.G.M. HELD ON 26TH JANUARY 1991
AT THE CHALICE FOUNDATION, 117 MANSFORD STREET, LONDON E.2.

1. Election of Chairman The General Secretary opened the meeting by welcoming the 60 members present, including a special welcome to Mr. Ron Mills and members of the East Northants Section on their first attendance. Apologies for absence had been received from Mrs. D. Bazely, Mrs. P. Edwards and Messrs. T. Blake, W. Cliff, W. Collins, A. Lovelace, E. Mascall, A. Thurston and J. Wyatt.

Nominations were then invited for Chairman of the meeting. Mr. D.W. Brunwin was unanimously elected. The Secretary first asked members to note that there would be four items to be taken under "other business":- (a) 40th anniversary plans; (b) Haultwick re-union; (c) Presentation of Rose Ford plaque; (d) Data Protection Act. He apologised for omitting these from the published agenda. Mr. Brunwin then took the Chair.

2. Minutes The (abridged) Minutes of the A.G.M. held on 27th Jan. 1990 and circulated with the Agenda were taken as read and approved.
3. Matters Arising It was reported that Mr. A. Fidoe had resigned as Runs Leader of the Stevenage/Nth. Herts Section in May 1990 and had been succeeded by Mrs. Carole Green.
4. General Secretary's Report Mr. Rowland said that the Club had continued to flourish in strength of membership, finances, and in a wide range of cycling activities, these latter being mainly organised locally by the twelve Section Secretaries. The main cycling event open to all was the 100-mile reliability ride organised by Doug Brunwin which again had been well supported.

During the year efforts had been maintained to achieve good communication within the membership by regular reports of Committee activities in "Signpost" and by the publishing of typed minutes of meetings to all committee members so that those not attending were kept informed. Apart from routine business the main items dealt with were:-

- (a) Set-up of the Map Lending Library by Jim Stevens
- (b) Re-write of the Club's history by Rose Ford and Eva Paine
- (c) The decision to hold a 3-day event to celebrate the Club's 40th anniversary
- (d) The renaming of certain sections
- (e) The use of a computer to maintain membership records.

During the year some controversy arose on the venues for Committee Meetings being held outside London (allowed by the rules since 1989) and from the implications of a letter published in "Signpost". Both these matters were reflected by motions on the current A.G.M. Agenda (Items 8 and 9).

Report concluded

Mr. W. Turner then asked whether the nominal entry fee of £1 for the '100' was sufficient to cover Mr. Brunwin's costs. Mr. Brunwin replied that he was content to meet the balance of the costs involved.

The report was accepted unanimously

5. Treasurer's Report Mr. E. Gobell referred to the audited Statement of Accounts for the year ended 30th Sept. 1990, published with the Agenda and which showed an excess of Income over Expenditure of £168 and a closing balance of £2064. The main item of expenditure was again the publication of "Signpost" (£1251), an increase of some 15% on the previous year, being mainly due to increased postal rates. In reply to a questioner, Mr. Gobell said that the question of tax avoidance on building society interest rates would be investigated.

Mr. Gobell was thanked for his report which was accepted unanimously.

6. Membership Secretary's Report Mrs. E. Blake, reporting on her first year in office, said that membership was now approaching 800. Some 80 new members had joined in the year but there had been several deaths. About 100 subscriptions due for renewal had not yet been paid. Now that membership records were maintained by computer only brief details of new members registered would appear in issues of "Signpost".

This point was queried by Mr. D. Ledger who proposed that the complete list of members be available to any member, subject to payment.
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Mr. G. Hooper seconded the motion. After an amendment that such a charge should be £20 per time was carried, the motion was put and lost by a large majority.

The report was then accepted and a vote of thanks was given to Edie Blake.

7. Term of Office of President - Item 7(a) withdrawn by Committee.

Item 7(b) proposed by Mr. E. Engel:- Club Rule 5(a) - Delete after "President" (who may be elected etc.) and insert "who shall not be eligible for re-election" - was put to the meeting and CARRIED.

8. Location of Committee Meetings The Chairman stated that as the four proposals 8(a) to 8(d) were contradictory, each would be taken separately:- 8(a) - Proposed by Mrs. M. Wright "that Committee Meetings be held within the London Transport area" - was discussed in the light of two members' complaints that it was impracticable for them to attend meetings in Essex and Kent and that it would be fairer if all had to travel to London. The motion was put and LOST.

8(b) - As neither proposer nor seconder was present and no proposal made from the floor the motion was not put.

8(c) - Proposed by Mrs. R. Ford "that the venue for Committee Meetings shall be at the discretion of the General Secretary etc..." - was then put and CARRIED.

8(d) - (Meetings to be held at a Central point in London) was consequently considered lost and not put to vote.

9. Procedure for nomination of Officers & Committee Members for election at A.G.M.

The proposition by Mrs. M. Wright that advance nominations for all posts be obtained in writing and published in "Signpost" prior to each A.G.M. was discussed. It appeared that some misunderstanding of the circumstances of the election of the Membership Secretary at the 1990 A.G.M. had occurred. The General Secretary stated that two nominations had been put to the meeting although one candidate had not been present and that Mrs. E. Blake had been elected on a show of hands. The motion was then put and LOST.

10. Club Map Librarian The Committee's proposal that this post be recognised and added to Committee was CARRIED.

11. Election of Officers 1991 The following were elected:-

13. Additional Committee Members (five) Mrs. K. Coldwell; Mrs. E. Paine; Mrs. N. Rainbow; Mr. R. Rumball; Mr. W. Godfrey (six nominations made - election by ballot).

14. Other Business (a) Fortieth Anniversary The Chairman reported on the plans made for the proposed 3-day event on 14-16 May, 1991. He anticipated that overnight accommodation would be available at the Club huts at Ugley. There would be organised rides each day and he was hoping that evening meals could be provided at the local Women's Institute/Village Hall using an outside caterer. Further details and a booking form would be included with the March issue of "Signpost" and Section Secretaries would be kept advised.

The proposals were given a general welcome, but one member regretted that no provision had been made for a week-end event to cater for those still at work.

(b) Haultwick Re-union In view of the 3-day event it was accepted that no separate Haultwick re-union would be necessary in 1991, as one of the evening meals at Ugley could become the subject of a special "get-together".

(c) 'Rose Ford' Plaque The winner of this award for the best "Signpost" article in 1990 was announced as Mr. Bill Newman and the plaque was duly presented to him by the President, her first official duty.

(d) Data Protection Act The General Secretary reported that no member had raised any objection to his/her name being included on the computerised membership record following the notice appearing in the December issue of "Signpost".

The meeting closed at 1.30 p.m. following which refreshments were available at nominal cost.

MINUTES OF A.G.M. HELD ON 25TH JANUARY 1992 AT THE CHALICE FOUNDATION,
117 MANSFORD STREET, LONDON E.2.

1. ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN Due to an accident in late December and subsequent hospitalisation the General Secretary was unable to be present and tendered his verbal apologies for absence. On his behalf a welcome was extended to the assembled gathering and nominations were invited for Chairman of the meeting. On a proposition of Mr. J. Stevens, seconded by Mr. W. Turner, Mr. D.W. Brunwin was elected unanimously.

Mr. Brunwin expressed a warm welcome to all who had made the effort to attend, particularly to those who had made rather lengthy journeys, and said that apologies for non-attendance had been received from Trevor and Edie Blake; Alec Cliff; Ted Groom; Carole Green; Doris Bazely; Alf Thurston and Charles Comport.
2. MINUTES OF LAST A.G.M. As these had already been circulated to all members Mr. W. Thorncroft proposed, seconded by Mr. E. Gobell, that these be taken as read. Carried
3. MATTERS ARISING In connection with the query regarding avoidance of tax on building society interest (Item 5 - Treasurer's Report) it was explained by Mr. Gobell that tax-free interest could only be claimed by personal individuals and not by group organisations such as clubs. The exception was 'Investment Accounts' which were not suitable for 40+ needs as there were too many restrictions regarding withdrawal of funds.
4. GENERAL SECRETARY'S REPORT Though Mr. Rowland had been unable, due to his accident, to prepare an official report, it was pointed out that all the Club's major activities, e.g. the 40th Anniversary celebrations, the 100 mile event in Essex and various sectional activities had already been fully reported in "Signpost" and that details of our membership situation and financial position would be covered by the subsequent reports from the Membership Secretary and Treasurer.
5. TREASURER'S REPORT Mr. E. Gobell referred to the audited Statement of Accounts for the year ended 30th September 1991, published with the Agenda. This showed an excess of Income over Expenditure of £240.47. Whilst at first glance this situation appeared satisfactory, had it not been for a donation to the Club from the estate of a late member, the Club's accounts would have been 'in the red'. During the year the cost of producing "Signpost" had risen, due to the increase in the cost of paper, envelopes and postage. The anniversary celebrations had led to a moderate charge on the Club, though this had been expected and, in the opinion of the committee, had been fully justified. Mr. Gobell further explained that although 'monies held' amounted to £2304.94, of this figure some £1788.40 was accounted for by subscriptions paid in advance. He therefore supported the proposal that in order to remain solvent there would have to be an increase in subscriptions.

Chairman thanked Mr. Gobell for his report which was accepted unanimously on a proposal by Mrs. E. Paine, seconded Mrs. R. Ford.
6. MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY'S REPORT In the absence of Mrs. Blake a written report from her was presented by the Chairman which indicated a steady intake of new members during 1991. Taking into account non-renewals and, sadly, some deaths, the membership now stood at 785. During the year under review 8 members had reached the age of 80 and with the 15 years or more service record had thus qualified for the presentation of a tankard or equivalent gift. Some had relinquished this right and had kindly asked that a donation in lieu be given to charity. Seven members would qualify for life membership after 1/1/92.

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Mrs. Blake thanked all members who had paid their subs promptly and indicated that she had enjoyed her second year of office. In the absence of any other nominations she would be happy to continue as Membership Sec. but in the event of a replacement being elected she would be quite happy to assist by continuing to maintain the computerised membership record and to produce quarterly the labels for "Signpost".

Chairman thanked Mrs. Blake for the sterling work she had put in for the Club and also for her report which was adopted on a proposition from Mr. E. Gobell, seconded Mrs. E. Paine.

7. SUBSCRIPTIONS Chairman referred to the Committee's motion (Item 7(b) on the Agenda) recommending that subscriptions be raised by £1.00 from 1st January 1993 to £3.50 per annum (£4.00 for married couples), commuted subscriptions due being amended accordingly. He pointed out that the Club made every effort to keep increases to the absolute minimum but stressed that it was the committee's responsibility to see that subscriptions were adequate to meet the Club's expenses.

Before this proposal came under discussion Mr. J. Stevens said he wished to table an amendment, proposing that the operative date be changed from 1st January 1993 to 1st October 1992. The Chairman was reluctant to allow this amendment to be tabled, feeling that to do so would invalidate the proxy votes which had been based on the published date of 1st January 1993. Mr. Stevens, however, was insistent that his proposal was valid and in order, explaining that if the date remained at 1.1.93., a member joining in the last quarter of the year, and thus paying the current and lower subscription, would, in effect, get 15 months' membership at the old rate, whereas existing members renewing at the start of 1993 would have to pay the increased amount. The Chairman then asked the meeting whether they wished this amendment to be put to the vote and a show of hands indicated that a majority were in favour.

However, before a vote could be taken, Mr. W. Thorncroft said he, too, wished to put a further amendment, i.e. that the operative date for an increase should be 1.1.92. This provoked some discussion, Mr. W. Godfrey supporting Mr. Thorncroft, taking the view that the gap of one year before increases could be put into effect was unsatisfactory; for example, postal increases usually took place in September, thus the Club had to meet higher charges which could not be recouped until fifteen months later. Mr. G. Hooper, whilst accepting this point, said he did not think members would be very happy to be told that higher subs were due immediately, though realising that those who had already paid promptly would not be affected.

Chairman again reiterated his disquiet at allowing this amendment to go forward but after inviting the views of those present and after a show of hands it was evident that the meeting wished these matters to be put to the vote.

The outcome was as follows:- Proposed W. Thorncroft - Seconded Mr. W. Godfrey - that subscriptions be raised from 1.1.92. NOT CARRIED (show of hands)

Proposed J. Stevens - Seconded Mr. W. Turner - that subscriptions be raised from 1.10.92. CARRIED (show of hands)

8. POWERS OF COMMITTEE The Committee's proposal (7(b) on the Agenda) then came up for discussion. If passed this would give the Committee power to set the level of annual subscriptions payable from 1st January each year following receipt of the audited accounts of each previous financial year. Mrs. Anna de Warrenne asked whether, if this proposal was carried and Club Rule 5 subsequently altered, it would thereafter prevent members from having any further say in what the level of subs would be.

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Chairman reassured Mrs. de Warrenne that whilst the committee would have power to fix subs, members would still be able to make their views known at an AGM and changes could be made if they felt the figure to be unreasonable. He again stressed that the Committee would give in-depth thought to their decisions on subs and would keep them to the barest minimum, whilst having due regard to the Club's commitments and financial position. (On a show of hands the proposal was CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY)

10. PRESENTATIONS

The "Rose Ford" Editorial Plaque was presented to Mr. F. Barrett who also received a Tankard for being the oldest rider to complete the 'Club 100' organised by Mr. D. Brunwin. A plaque was also presented to Mr. Eric Gobell to mark the five years of service which he had given to the Club as Treasurer.

Chairman congratulated all recipients and took the opportunity to thank all committee members, officers and runs leaders for their dedicated service during the year.

11. HAULTWICK RE-UNION Mrs. A. de Warrenne proposed Tuesday, 23rd June, 1992 at the 'Rest and Welcome', Haultwick, which met with unanimous approval.

12. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Mr. W.J. Turner thanked those present for according him the honour of being President. He felt that the Club had enjoyed a successful year

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The Club were prominent in a randonnee held in France, receiving an award for being the third largest contingent taking part. He, himself, had received an award for being the oldest finisher in his class, a success he had achieved with the help of fellow riders who had supported him throughout frightful weather conditions. He expressed his gratitude to them and wished the club an equally successful 1992.

The Chairman again stressed the Club's objective of a closer integration between sections, some way toward which had been achieved by the 40th anniversary celebrations in 1991, in which many other sections had been represented. There was some discussion as to whether similar functions could be arranged and the consensus of opinion seemed to be that periodic events of this nature would be welcomed by many members.

Chairman said that a buffet lunch was being organised at the Victoria Hut on the 11th June, to which he hoped members from different sections would come. Further details would be given later and if members from further afield wished for overnight accommodation he was sure this could be arranged. He hoped that other inter-section activities would be arranged in order to achieve closer integration between members. If, for example, the E. Northants mooted a run inviting other sections to participate, he felt sure there would be some support.

Mr. Brunwin further announced that he would again be organising the "Club 100" on July 16th as well as the CTC 100 mile 'Triennial Ride' in the Essex area on June 14th. This event would start from the Chelmer C.C. Clubroom with probable food breaks at Topppesfield and Henham. Riders over 50 years of age were eligible to enter, or below that age if participants had ridden in previous years when the age limit was lower.

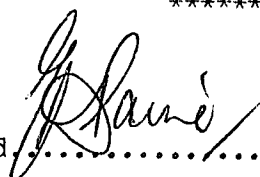
Mr. W. Newman referred to the fact that the Club might be in some difficulty if, at any time, he were not able to continue as publisher of "Signpost". This led to a general discussion on whether the time was right to explore other methods of publication. Stencil cutting was now obsolete and tedious and there were now simpler ways of reproduction providing the Club could afford them, bearing in mind that the magazine did not have the benefit of advertising revenue. Mr. Duncan Ledger then proposed, seconded by Mrs. E. Paine that the committee during the current year should carry out an in-depth investigation to ascertain whether it was now time to make a change in our methods and, if so, what changes could the Club afford to make.

Obituaries: Mr. W. Brunwin reported the death (via Mr. Bill Moore) of Sid Durrant of Potters Bar. The funeral was to be held at New Southgate Cemetery on 30th Jan. On behalf of the Club he expressed condolences to Sid's family and said that members had also been saddened to hear of the recent deaths of both Charlie Mucklejohn and Arnold Fielden.

Mr. W. Turner also reported that our member in New Zealand, Les Rudkins, had recently suffered a stroke. He was in touch with Les's family and would report further as news was received.

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Chairman thanked Mr. Gobell for his report which was accepted unanimously on a proposal by Mrs. E. Paine, seconded Mrs. R. Ford.
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Mrs. Blake thanked all members who had paid their subs promptly and indicated that she had enjoyed her second year of office. In the absence of any other nominations she would be happy to continue as Membership Sec. but in the event of a replacement being elected she would be quite happy to assist by continuing to maintain the computerised membership record and to produce quarterly the labels for "Signpost".

Chairman thanked Mrs. Blake for the sterling work she had put in for the Club and also for her report which was adopted on a proposition from Mr. E. Gobell, seconded Mrs. E. Paine.

7. SUBSCRIPTIONS Chairman referred to the Committee's motion (Item 7(b) on the Agenda) recommending that subscriptions be raised by £1.00 from 1st January 1993 to £3.50 per annum (£4.00 for married couples), commuted subscriptions due being amended accordingly. He pointed out that the Club made every effort to keep increases to the absolute minimum but stressed that it was the committee's responsibility to see that subscriptions were adequate to meet the Club's expenses.

Before this proposal came under discussion Mr. J. Stevens said he wished to table an amendment, proposing that the operative date be changed from 1st January 1993 to 1st October 1992. The Chairman was reluctant to allow this amendment to be tabled, feeling that to do so would invalidate the proxy votes which had been based on the published date of 1st January 1993. Mr. Stevens, however, was insistent that his proposal was valid and in order, explaining that if the date remained at 1.1.93., a member joining in the last quarter of the year, and thus paying the current and lower subscription, would, in effect, get 15 months' membership at the old rate, whereas existing members renewing at the start of 1993 would have to pay the increased amount. The Chairman then asked the meeting whether they wished this amendment to be put to the vote and a show of hands indicated that a majority were in favour.

However, before a vote could be taken, Mr. W. Thorncroft said he, too, wished to put a further amendment, i.e. that the operative date for an increase should be 1.1.92. This provoked some discussion, Mr. W. Godfrey supporting Mr. Thorncroft, taking the view that the gap of one year before increases could be put into effect was unsatisfactory; for example, postal increases usually took place in September, thus the Club had to meet higher charges which could not be recouped until fifteen months later. Mr. G. Hooper, whilst accepting this point, said he did not think members would be very happy to be told that higher subs were due immediately, though realising that those who had already paid promptly would not be affected.

Chairman again reiterated his disquiet at allowing this amendment to go forward but after inviting the views of those present and after a show of hands it was evident that the meeting wished these matters to be put to the vote.

The outcome was as follows:- Proposed W. Thorncroft - Seconded Mr. W. Godfrey - that subscriptions be raised from 1.1.92. NOT CARRIED (show of hands)

Proposed J. Stevens - Seconded Mr. W. Turner - that subscriptions be raised from 1.10.92. CARRIED (show of hands)

8. POWERS OF COMMITTEE The Committee's proposal (7(b) on the Agenda) then came up for discussion. If passed this would give the Committee power to set the level of annual subscriptions payable from 1st January each year following receipt of the audited accounts of each previous financial year. Mrs. Anna de Warrenne asked whether, if this proposal was carried and Club Rule 5 subsequently altered, it would thereafter prevent members from having any further say in what the level of subs would be.

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Chairman reassured Mrs. de Warrenne that whilst the committee would have power to fix subs, members would still be able to make their views known at an AGM and changes could be made if they felt the figure to be unreasonable. He again stressed that the Committee would give in-depth thought to their decisions on subs and would keep them to the barest minimum, whilst having due regard to the Club's commitments and financial position. (On a show of hands the proposal was CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY)

Chairman congratulated all recipients and took the opportunity to thank all committee members, officers and runs leaders for their dedicated service during the year.

11. HAULTWICK RE-UNION Mrs. A. de Warrenne proposed Tuesday, 23rd June, 1992 at the 'Rest and Welcome', Haultwick, which met with unanimous approval.

12. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Mr. W. B. Turner thanked those present for according him the honour of being President. He felt that the Club had enjoyed a successful year

over.....

The Club were prominent in a randonneé held in France, receiving an award for being the third largest contingent taking part. He, himself, had received an award for being the oldest finisher in his class, a success he had achieved with the help of fellow riders who had supported him throughout frightful weather conditions. He expressed his gratitude to them and wished the club an equally successful 1992.

The Chairman again stressed the Club's objective of a closer integration between sections, some way toward which had been achieved by the 40th anniversary celebrations in 1991, in which many other sections had been represented. There was some discussion as to whether similar functions could be arranged and the consensus of opinion seemed to be that periodic events of this nature would be welcomed by many members.

Chairman said that a buffet lunch was being organised at the Victoria Hut on the 11th June, to which he hoped members from different sections would come. Further details would be given later and if members from further afield wished for overnight accommodation he was sure this could be arranged. He hoped that other inter-section activities would be arranged in order to achieve closer integration between members. If, for example, the E. Northants mooted a run inviting other sections to participate, he felt sure there would be some support.

Mr. Brunwin further announced that he would again be organising the "Club 100" on July 16th as well as the CTC 100 mile 'Triennial Ride' in the Essex area on June 14th. This event would start from the Chelmer C.C. Clubroom with probable food breaks at Topppesfield and Henham. Riders over 50 years of age were eligible to enter, or below that age if participants had ridden in previous years when the age limit was lower.


Mr. W. Newman referred to the fact that the Club might be in some difficulty if, at any time, he were not able to continue as publisher of "Signpost". This led to a general discussion on whether the time was right to explore other methods of publication. Paine that the committee during the current year should carry out an in-depth investigation to ascertain whether it was now time to make a change in our methods and, if so, what changes could the Club afford to make.

On behalf of the Club he expressed condolences to Sid's family and said that members had also been saddened to hear of the recent deaths of both Charlie Mucklejohn and Arnold Fielden.

Mr. W. Turner also reported that our member in New Zealand, Les Rudkins, had recently suffered a stroke. He was in touch with Les's family and would report further as news was received.

MINUTES OF COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON 7TH MARCH, 1992
AT 1, THE AVENUE, BRENTWOOD, ESSEX

Present: Mr. D.W. Brunwin (chairman) and 11 members

Apologies for Absence: Ms. C. Green; Mr. & Mrs. J. Rainbow;
Mr. E. Gobell

1. Minutes of Meeting, 16th November, 1991: Accepted as true record.

2. Matters Arising

- (a) Mr. Rowland reported that a letter sent to him by Ms. C. Green (Stevenage & N. Herts) dated 8th November had apparently been lost in the post. He had received a copy on 13th December but the matter of a possible combined run between that section and Essex 'B' now appeared to be closed. Carole Green had, however, offered a venue in Baldock, Herts, for a future committee meeting (see Minute 13 below).

The chairman reminded the meeting that arrangements were in hand for an inter-section buffet lunch at the Victoria Hut, Ugley, on 11th June.

- (b) AGREED that a stock of 200 metal badges be ordered and that sale price of badges be increased to £1.00 (from 80p).

3. Minutes of A.G.M., 25th January, 1992: Accepted as true record

4. Matters Arising

- (a) Annual subscriptions - following on the decision taken at the A.G.M. "that subscriptions be raised from 1.10.92." there was some considerable discussion on the exact intention with regard to future years, the General Secretary seeking guidance on the consequent alterations to the relevant paragraphs of Club Rule No. 6. It was AGREED that he should prepare a revised draft for consideration at the next meeting.
- (b) Proxy votes - it was pointed out that acceptance at the A.G.M. of an amendment to the proposal published in the agenda paper had, in effect, invalidated the proxy votes received for and against the original proposal.

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AGM | Following discussion in which it was noted that members voting by proxy could not be influenced by explanations of proposals given at the A.G.M., it was RESOLVED TO RECOMMEND to the next A.G.M. that the proxy system be abolished by deletion of paragraph 4(d) of Club Rules.

- (c) Reported that the catering provided by Mrs. E. Paine and helpers had realised a profit of £12. A statement indicating use of part of this sum, together with cash balance, was passed to the Treasurer.

The Committee wished to thank Eva Paine for her work in organising refreshments and deputising for the General Secretary.

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5. General Secretary's Report

Reported receipt of a letter from Ms. C. Green (Stevenage & N. Herts) regarding the advantages of notifying public house licensees in advance of section visits, particularly where more than one section might be visiting and facilities thereby being stretched.

Members present said that this was already their normal practice but it was difficult to forecast what members might be attending.

Reported receipt of a letter from licensee of Prince of Wales public house at Green Tye, near Much Hadham, inviting custom from cyclists. Snack meals were available on Sundays. It was noted that the Essex 'B' Group had recently visited this venue and the pub was known to other cyclists.

"80-Plus" Tankards: reported that tankards were now available for presentation to Mr. Bill Turner and to the Kersey brothers and that a presentation ceremony had been arranged at the Black Horse, Paslow Common, on Tuesday, 17th March 1992. Frank and Doris Green had declined the offer of an award in favour of a donation to their local hospice. On the advice of Mrs. E. Engel the award due to Charlie Merrett had been deferred, due to his general condition.

Sadly, our member Harry Hitch (Henham) had collapsed and died suddenly on 1st March while attending an event. A letter of condolence on behalf of the Club had been sent to his widow. The chairman also referred to the recent death of Charlie Bowtle (Dulwich), also a 40-plus member.

6. Membership Secretary's Report

Mrs. E. Blake reported a slight fall in membership which now stood at 764, including 41 new members. There had been 3 resignations and 8 deaths since the last report in "Signpost". Mr. J.L. Stevens asked to be advised of those who had not renewed membership so that he could stop sending "Signpost" - this sometimes reminded people that their subscription was overdue! The chairman reported that his recent letter to "Cycling Weekly" had prompted 12 enquiries about the Club, three of which resulted in new members.

7. Treasurer's Report

Mrs. M. Featherston circulated copies of a statement showing the movement of Club funds since the last report, with an excess of income over expenditure of £145.77.

Mrs. Ford queried the payment of £52.88 to Trade Typewriters paid by the Treasurer as she had already paid the firm by cheque when collecting her repaired typewriter. Mrs. Featherston replied that when she had received the invoice from Mrs. Ford it had not been receipted and she had assumed that no payment had been made. She would contact Trade Typewriters to obtain a refund.

8. "Signpost" Team

The March issue was about to be distributed and would contain notice of an offer to arrange a new 40-Plus section in the Colchester/Tendring area by Reg Horsnell of Harwich who was a frequent visitor to Essex 'A' section destinations. The Committee wished him success in his efforts.

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8. (Cont'd.)

Consideration was then given to a proposal that the production of "Signpost" be updated by abolishing the traditional use of stencils in favour of modern reprographic methods. An investigation had been carried out by Mrs. E. Paine on behalf of the General Secretary and a few copies of her report had been distributed to the "Signpost" team. Due to an offer from a local comprehensive school with its own printing department, the costs of producing the magazine on A4 paper to a better standard could be contained within present limits. Production commercially would be more expensive. Examples of the school's work were distributed.

It was noted that the new method would ease the work both of Editor Rose Ford and of printer Bill Newman. Runs lists could also be produced in similar fashion on A4 paper. Stocks of duplicating paper presently held were not excessive and could be discounted.

It was AGREED that the revised methods of production be adopted for publication of the June issue of "Signpost" onward and of future issues of the runs lists. Thanks were expressed to Eva Paine for the work she had put in to prepare the report. The General Secretary undertook to advise Mrs. Mary Cheesman of the decision regarding runs lists and to express the Committee's appreciation of her work in the past. Runs leaders would be instructed to submit their lists to the General Secretary in future.

9. Map Librarian - nothing to report

10. Section Secretaries' Reports

Mr. Ted Brampton said that the use of North Weald Golf Course for elevenses had not proved satisfactory but the "Cross Keys" cafe at Thornwood Common now made cyclists very welcome.

Mr. J.L. Stevens reported that a combined Essex/S.E. Section (Kent) run was to take place on Wednesday, 19th August, starting at King George's Playing Field, Brentwood. There had been an unfortunate incident at the "Prince Albert" at Blackmore when the licensee objected to 'own' sandwiches being consumed in the bar on Sundays.

Mr. J. Scrutton referred to the proposed combined run on 11th June when a buffet lunch would be available at the Victoria C.C. hut in Ugley.

11. Publicity for Cycling

Mr. A. Crocker referred to documents regarding traffic control and cyclists which he suggested should be used for lobbying purposes. He was asked to submit evidence on behalf of the Club to appropriate councillors.

The chairman reported that the Essex County Women's Institutes were campaigning for cycling helmets to be made compulsory. He had written a letter pointing out some of the complications of helmet wearing and had received an appreciative reply.

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12. Life Membership

Mrs. R. Ford referred to a claim by a Mr. & Mrs. H. Marshall (made via Ted Groom) that they were granted Life Membership of the Club before emigrating to Australia in 1957. Mrs. Ford quoted from old minutes but it was felt that no action need be taken after so many years.

13. Next Meeting

Mr. J.L. Stevens said that if a meeting was to be held before publication of June "Signpost" it would need to be in late May (holiday problems). Members felt that this was too early and were reminded of the offer of accommodation at Baldock, Herts. It was AGREED that the next meeting be held on Saturday, 4th July, 1992, at an address in Baldock, subject to arrangement with Ms. Carole Green.

PRINTING OF "SIGNPOST" BY AN OUTSIDE FACTION

A FEASIBILITY STUDY

(Carried out on behalf of and at the request of the Secretary 40+ C.C.)

1. Objectives

- (a) to move away from the tiresome and antiquated method of stencil cutting
- (b) to reduce pressure on the Editor
- (c) to make proof reading easier
- (d) to improve reproduction of both printed text and, to a greater extent, line drawings
- (e) to relieve the present publisher of many hours of unpaid labour, not to mention personal and (unclaimed) expenses
- (f) to safeguard the future of the magazine, bearing in mind the age of both the editor and publisher and, in the event of crisis, the potential difficulty of finding suitable replacements for them. For example, the Editor will at some time in the future need an operation for cataract. What then?

2. Cost

Three quotations have been received:

- (i) Cyclist printer - 12 A4 pages, plus lightweight card cover based on 600 copies.....£300 per issue
- (ii) Small printing company - 12 A4 pages, plus lightweight card cover - based on 700 copies.....£240 per issue
- (iii) Local comprehensive school, having its own reprographic department - 14 A4 pages, plus front and back cover in coloured paper to customer's choice - based on 650 copies.....£159.25 per issue

3. Comparison

Mr. W. Newman estimates the present net production cost of the magazine at 20p per copy, but this figure takes no account of the money he expends from his own pocket - a situation unlikely to continue from any future replacement for him. The net cost if the Club used Quotation (iii) would 24.5p per copy.

4. Collating

None of the above quotations included collating. If the magazine is put out for printing Mr. Newman has indicated his willingness to continue to handle this duty and to deliver to the distributor as now.

5. Quality

The comprehensive school quoting under (iii) already prints several church magazines. They have given assurances that, provided our original typescripts are clear and sharp, the result will be first-class. Turn-round time would be in the region of one week. In the unlikely event that printing dates clash with school holidays, special arrangements are made to deal with any large jobs which arise.

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6. Delivery

In the event of Quotation (iii) being taken up, Mrs. E. Paine has indicated a willingness to collect the master sheets from the editor; collect from the school when completed and deliver the printed pages back to the editor for collection by Mr. Newman for collating. He already has to make the journey at present to collect the editor's stencils so extra mileage is not involved.

7. Weight and Postage

14 pages of A4 paper plus 2 A4 cover sheets weighs just over 90 grams. Taking into account the Runs List and a manilla envelope this would be continuing at the present 34p postage rate.

8. An Alternative Option

If the Club opted for 12 A4 pages printed both sides, plus covers printed one side only, thus equating to 26 A4 printed sides overall, this would equate to roughly a 30-page edition if printed on Quarto as now. Here, the Gestetner restriction means the bottom-edge reaches 'line 57' but on A4 (with no Gestetner restriction) reaches line 70. Also, with A4 being fractionally wider, this often results in a further, though minimal, 'line economy'. With this reduction in pages and reverting to plastic envelopes, whilst still allowing for the insertion of the Runs List, it is estimated that the 100 gram postage limit could be achieved and thus save 6p per copy. A quotation for plastic envelopes was £30.55p per thousand, or 3.05p each, roughly 1.25p each dearer than the present manilla type. To obtain this price, however, the minimum quantity would have to be 5,000. Thus, it can be seen that if the Club took this course, the magazine could be printed under Quotation (iii) at no extra cost at all. Also, under Quotation (iii) if less than the 650 copies were required, then the cost would be reduced pro-rata as the costing is done on a 'page' basis and clients are merely charged for the number of pages.

9. The Club has been very fortunate in having the services of such a good tradesman as Mr. W. Newman. Frequently he has had to produce an acceptable job with far-from-perfect stencils. This report in no way criticises his efforts - rather the reverse. Also, whatever the Club decides with regard to the magazine we would still have to ask him to cope with stencils for the Runs List and other odd ancillary items, though these could be printed outside if so desired, e.g. a runs list of 4 A4 'sides' would cost 3p each.

Mr. E. Gobell, Mr. & Mrs. J. Rainbow.

1. Minutes of Meeting, 7th March 1992: Before consideration of the minutes in detail the Chairman directed that in future the proposer and seconder of all motions should be recorded.

1 (a) Minute No. 11 The Chairman reported that since his letter to the Women's Institute they had modified their previous recommendation that cycling helmets be made compulsory.

1 (b) Minute No. 12 The Chairman commented that Mr. & Mrs. Marshall had never qualified as life members as they had not met the terms published in 1957. Mrs. Ford said that she had asked Mr. Ted Groom to reply to the letter from Mr. & Mrs. Marshall.

Subject to the foregoing, Mr. H. Rumball proposed and Mr. W. Newman seconded, that the minutes of 7th March 1992 be accepted.

2. Matters Arising

Minute No. 4 (a) The General Secretary referred to his report dated 15th June 1992, circulated with the Agenda, regarding the A.G.M. decision to raise annual subscriptions from 1st October 1992. It was noted that the effective date of 1st October would apply only to new members joining from then to 31st December 1992, all existing members paying the increased subscription from 1st January 1993. The hitherto long delay between an A.G.M. decision to raise rates and its execution would be eliminated by the powers granted at the A.G.M. to enable the Committee to set the level of future subscriptions from 1st January yearly, as judged necessary following the results of the financial year ended the previous 30th September. Club Rule No. 5 would therefore require the additional clause "The Committee shall set the level of annual subscriptions payable from 1st January each year following receipt of the audited accounts of the previous financial year" (authority Minute No. 8 of A.G.M. 25/1/92).

The Committee then discussed the financial effects of Club Rule No. 6 (d) allowing members to commute five years' subscriptions by payment of a sum equal to four times the amount of the annual subscription current at the time. It was felt that this concession of, in effect, a year's free membership, could no longer be justified.

On the proposal of Mr. J.L. Stevens, seconded by Mrs. D. Bazely, it was RESOLVED TO RECOMMEND:-

That the next A.G.M. approve the amendment of the first sentence of Club Rule No. 6 (d) to read "Any member who has completed a full year's membership may commute five years' subscriptions by payment of a sum equal to five times the amount of the current annual subscription".

Proxy Votes

The suggestion contained in Section 2 of the General Secretary's report was not considered.

3. General Secretary's Report

Mr. Rowland said he regretted having to report the recent sad deaths of John Ambrose (23/5/92) and Gerald Leigh (27/5/92). Correspondence with various relatives was reported, including appreciation from Mrs. Rose Hitch and Mrs. Ivy Durrant, the latter acknowledging the posthumous presentation of an '80-Plus' tankard due to her late husband Sydney.

A member then stated that he understood that Pat Hanlon (Mrs. P. Clarke) had died recently. Mr. Rowland undertook to make enquiries. — *happily not true!*

A letter had been received from the Kersey brothers enclosing a donation to the Club following presentation of their '80-Plus' tankards at a recent ceremony at the 'Black Horse', Common. Further qualifiers for the award of tankards in 1992 were expected to be :- Mr. J. Turner (Enfield) 4/8/92; Violet Whybrow (Westcliff) 9/11/92; A. Thurston (Gloucester) 30/8/92; Albert Murphy (Wickford) 25/12/92.

At this point a proposal to abolish the award of tankards did not receive a seconder.

4. Membership Secretary's Report Mrs. E. Blake reported that 31 new members had been accepted since 7th March and total membership was now over 800.

A suggestion had been received that details of the 40 Plus C.C. should appear in the CTC Handbook. Members felt this to be unnecessary.

Mrs. Blake said that she was sending out details of the Map Library to new members but stocks were running low. Mr. Stevens said that further supplies could be made available as Mr. Newman still held the stencils. Mr. Newman agreed to run off a further supply.

5. Treasurer's Report

Mr. Rowland presented a typed report on Mrs. Featherston's behalf. He explained that he had agreed to operate a temporary account during Mrs. Featherston's retirement holiday lasting until 30th September. With the Chairman's approval he would be meeting all bills during that period and had received a cash advance of £700 to cover anticipated costs. The cash would be held in Mr. Rowland's Abbey National Bldg. Soc. A/C. Ref. K2411943ROW.

The Treasurer's report for the period 8th March - 7th June 1992 was then considered. The report showed an excess of expenditure over income of £419.36, mainly due to the cost of the March edition of "Signpost" and the purchase of a stock of 5,000 plastic envelopes.

Certain queries were raised on details of the account:-

- (a) Cost of plaque for retiring Treasurer was shown as £67.43. This was clearly excessive but it was thought that the figure, in fact, covered the cost of two tankards as well as the plaque.
- (b) Two cheques totalling £15.30 (£4.50 and £10.80) had been credited to the A/C but were unallocated as the Treasurer had no details of their origin.
- (c) The amount standing to the credit of the Club at 7/6/92 was shown as :-

Members were not sure why the accounts were split into these two sections.

6. "Signpost" Team

There was general approval of the new format and methods of production. Mr. Rowland introduced a statement prepared by Mrs. Eva Paine indicating that the Club saved about 1p per copy as follows:-

The net cost of producing the magazine, runs list and '100' entry form was approx. 24p per copy compared with 21p by the old method. There was a further marginal increase incurred by the use of plastic envelopes compared with manilla, but these two increases were more than cancelled out by the saving of some 6p per copy on postage.

It was noted that special arrangements would be made at the school for handling material from about 24th August although the school was closed until the end of that month.

Mr. Newman said that if ever production at the school had to be discontinued and the cost of an alternative commercial service proved unacceptable the equipment for reverting to the original system would remain available.

7. Map Librarian

Mr. Stevens said that only one loan of maps had been made since the last meeting. A suggestion had been made that guide books might also be kept in the Library, but space considerations made this impracticable, unless another person was willing to start up such a service.

8. Section Secretaries' Reports

Mrs. D. Bazely said that the numbers on runs in the South Beds Section were now so large that some public houses were unable to

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cope. Splitting the Section (as with Essex) might become necessary. Mr. R. Mills said that the E. Northants Section used 6 pubs in rotation. E. Herts had occasional difficulties but Mrs. Rumball said that there had been a good attendance at the Haultwick re-union. Mr. J. Scrutton (Essex 'A') said that some 35 members had attended the lunch arranged at the Victoria Hut on 11th June.

Mr. J. Stevens reported that the pub at Bishop's Green had been dropped due to an unhelpful attitude by the licensee. He also gave early notice that a new leader would be required for the Essex Sunday Section in 1993 as he was giving up at the end of the year. Mrs. Carole Green announced two changes to the current runs list of the Stevenage and N. Herts Section, the destination for 23rd July now being Pirton, The Fox, and for 3rd September Upper Gravenhurst, the Green Dragon. Mr. G. Hooper said that the St. Albans Section were averaging 6 members on runs and 11-14 at lunch.

Birthday Rides

There was some discussion on the frequency of future birthday rides but no firm conclusion was reached. Mr. Brunwin said he would not be available to organise the rides in future years.

Next Meeting

Agreed for 31st October, 1992, at Waltham Cross, by invitation of Mr. & Mrs. H. Rumball.

Vote of Thanks

The meeting closed with a vote of thanks for the kind hospitality provided by Mr. Bert Bodsworth, which members had greatly enjoyed.

40-PLUS COMMITTEE MEETING 4TH JULY 1992

Matters arising from consideration of Minutes of A.G.M. 25th Jan. 1992

General Secretary's Report

1. A.G.M. Minute No. 7 - That subscriptions be raised from 1.10.92.

I read this as a "one off" decision, not setting any precedent for changing the normal annual subscription renewal date of 1st January. It will directly affect only those who happen to join the Club between 1st October and 31st December 1992. They will pay the 1993 rate for up to 15 months' membership.

The concern of other members about the hitherto delay time (approx. 11 months) between an A.G.M. decision taken in late January to raise the amount of subscription, and its implementation on 1st January the following year should be eliminated by the A.G.M. decision to empower the Committee to set the level of subscriptions from 1st January each year.

The order of events in the conduct of the Club's financial affairs would then be :-

- 1.1 Club's financial year runs 1st October - 30th September (as now)
- 1.2 Treasurer prepares end of year accounts (Rule 7(e)) to present to Committee at its November meeting (as now)
- 1.3 Committee will then decide whether or not to increase annual subscriptions from 1st January, i.e. thus taking effect only 3 months after close of financial year.
- 1.4 Committee's decision will be published in Christmas edition of "Signpost", together with the Agenda paper for the January A.G.M., thus giving notice to members before new subscriptions become due on 1st January.
- 1.5 If the A.G.M. dislike the increase in subscriptions their remedy will be not to re-elect the Committee.

Turning now to the concern that new members joining after 30th September "get away with" up to 15 months' membership, I think that is something which, as with other clubs, we simply have to accept. One alternative would be to charge all new members a nominal registration fee (say 50p) on top of the current subscription. (The other point to bear in mind is that no refund is made to the estates of members happening to die, say, three months after paying a full year's subscription!).

Recommendations

- (a) That Club Rule No. 5 "Constitution and Powers of Committee" be amended by the addition of the clause:- "The Committee shall set the level of annual subscriptions payable from 1st January each year following receipt of the audited accounts of the previous financial year".
- (b) That no change be made to Club Rule No. 6 "Subscriptions".

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2. Proxy Votes

The Committee decided at its March meeting to recommend that the A.G.M. proxy voting system be abolished. This followed the Chairman's reluctant decision to allow a verbal amendment to be put to the meeting; a departure from our normal practice.

On reflection, I suggest that we could continue the proxy voting system by adding on the proxy form a clause authorising the Chairman (or any other nominee) to vote on the member's behalf in the event of any amendment to the published agenda items being allowed to be put.

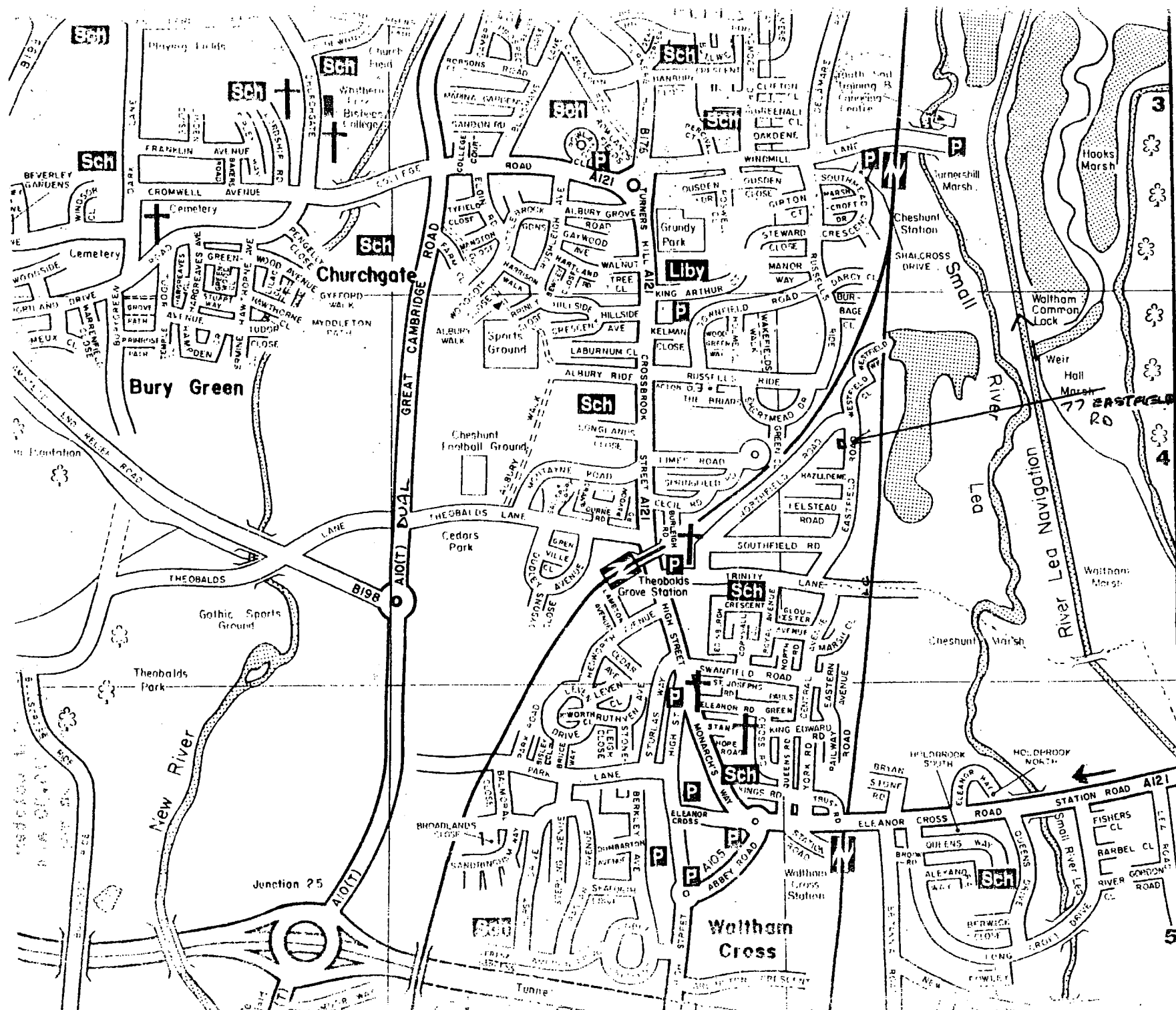

Present: Mr. D.W. Brunwin (Chairman) and 17 members

Apologies for Absence: Mrs. D. Bazely; Mr. W. Godfrey; Mr. G. Hooper;
Mr. R. Mills

1. Minutes of Meeting, 4th July, 1992: Having been circulated previously, Mr. J. Rainbow proposed and Mr. E. Brampton seconded, that the minutes be accepted (AGREED).
2. Matters Arising:
 - (a) Minute No. 3: the rumour of Pat Hanlon's decease was, happily, not true. Messrs. J. Turner and A. Thurston had declined offer of 80-Plus tankards. Mrs. V. Whybrow had expressed wish to receive a plaque in lieu of tankard.
 - (b) Minute No. 5: the statement showing the division of Club funds between the Working A/C and the Bob Finnemore A/C was further discussed. The Treasurer explained that the accounts were already separated in the Club's books when she took over although not shown separately when final accounts were presented annually. The view was expressed that the Bob Finnemore A/C had originally been intended to be spent on items of a capital nature or other special items.

Following discussion it was proposed by Mr. J. Rainbow, seconded by Mr. W. Turner, that the two accounts be amalgamated. MOTION CARRIED, with one dissenter.

3. General Secretary's Report

- (a) Mr. Rowland said that, sadly, he had been advised of the deaths of four members: Leonard Main (Garstang, Lancs); Stan Jorgensen (Billericay); Ted Harrison (Whitstable) and Ron Kelly (Hockley), the last-named collapsing while on the CTC Birthday Rides. Letters of condolence had been sent.
- (b) The Southend branch of the Motor Neurone Disease Association was organising a sponsored cycle ride to raise funds for research, the run to take place on 22nd November on a 36 mile circuit starting and finishing at Rochford Hospital. The Secretary had attended a meeting at which representatives of the Southend & County, Basildon and Shaftesbury C.C.'s had been present, who had all agreed to support the project and publicize it to their members.

It was AGREED that this was a suitable event for 40 Plus members to support. Mr. Rowland would send details to the Southend Section (Mr. F.H. Barrett).

4. Membership Secretary's Report

- (a) Mrs. E. Blake reported that membership now stood at the record total of 823. She referred to the draft membership application form circulated with the Agenda papers. AGREED that 300 forms should be printed at a cost of £4.50, but that the stated price of Club metal badges would need to be reviewed (See Minute 5(d) below).

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- (b) Mrs. Blake asked for guidance on the membership subscription to be charged for Mrs. Olivia Saunders following her husband Eddie's qualification for life membership. AGREED that Mrs. Saunders should in future pay the single member's rate.
- (c) Mr. Charles Merrett: In view of the circumstances of Mr. Merrett's health and hospitalisation it was AGREED that he should not be charged for membership and would not receive copies of "Signpost".
- (d) Membership application from Canada: Mrs. Blake referred to a membership application received from a Mr. N. Jenkins, resident in Canada, and to subsequent correspondence with our member, Mr. H. Hewes of Ontario. AGREED that Mr. Jenkins be not accepted for membership and a note to that effect to be recorded in "Signpost".
- (e) Mrs. Blake also regretted to have to report the recent death of Arthur Cook (Bishops Stortford); Walter Coombes (Erith) and also Dick Harper (Tottenham) whose widow had most kindly sent the Club a donation of £20 in his memory.

5. Treasurer's Report

- (a) Mrs. Featherston presented a statement on the movement of funds since July showing an excess of expenditure over income of £491.96, the two principal items being "Signpost" production costs of £340.04 and the purchase of 205 metal badges at £228.83.
- (b) The audited accounts for the financial year ended 30th September were then received, showing an excess of expenditure over income of £260.48, compared with a surplus of £240.47 in the previous year. The cash balance of £2,044.46 included subscriptions paid in advance amounting to £1,813.20 up to 1998.
- (c) Members were reminded that annual subscriptions for new members had risen on 1st October and for existing members would rise from January 1993. The Committee had been granted powers at the last A.G.M. to set the level of future subscriptions which would become effective from 1st January 1994. It was also noted that the existing stock of club jerseys (value £175) was proving difficult to move.
- (d) Following discussion it was AGREED that the price of metal badges be raised forthwith to £1.20 each and that details of the present stock of jerseys (style, size, etc.) should be published in "Signpost" (outside back cover suggested).
- (e) On the proposition of Mrs. E. Blake, seconded by Mr. J. Rainbow, it was RESOLVED that the Accounts for the year ended 30th September 1992 be adopted for presentation to the Annual General Meeting.

6. "Signpost" Team Report

The September issue had been produced satisfactorily and to time. Editor Rose Ford mentioned that her reference to the Buckshee Wheelers had drawn a response from Bernard Turner, a new recruit to the 40 Plus but an old member of the Ilford R.C.

Mr. J. Stevens warned of a possible increase in postal charges and spoke of his problems in getting the local post office to accept bulk for dispatch. It was suggested that he contact P.O. Customer Services.

South-East - Wednesdays - Mr. J. Rainbow referred to a successful week-end tour of Norfolk. The Christmas dinner would be on 16th December.

Sussex - Mr. R. Douglass (who had travelled from Worthing) said that support was steadily increasing and the Annual Dinner was to be at Rudgwick.

Stevenage & North Herts - Carole Green said that they were going well.

E. Northants)
South Beds) Reported by letter: happy progress and growing support.

It was also understood that the proposed section in the Harwich area was starting to make progress in recruitment.

9. A.G.M. 1993

The General Secretary asked for approval of 30th January 1993 as the date and Bethnal Green as the place of meeting - AGREED. It was also AGREED to request Mrs. E. Paine and her supporters to once again organise refreshments.

Members were reminded of the need to elect a new President at the conclusion of Mr. W. Turner's year of office. The name of Mr. E.J. Vesper (Woodford Green), a former Club secretary, was mentioned by the Chairman. Nominations would be taken on the day of the A.G.M.
